Kobe, Japan (UPI) - A bearded American adventurer whose plan to sail the Pacific in a small schooner ended in failure was towed into port today by the Japanese maritime safety agency.

Robert F. Moyes, 36, of Portland, Ore., told officials he has given up plans to make the crossing.

Five days later he was rescued by the Japanese fishing boat which discovered the craft foundering helplessly in the seas.

The seafarer was in good spirits as he landed here today. "I must go to the American Consulate for advice," he said.

Klamath Forest Notes Timber Sales

Yreka - More than 194 million board feet of timber was cut on the Klamath National forest during fiscal year 1959-60, W. M. Gerson, timber management officer, announced recently.

Total value of the timber cut is \$3,280,000, the value received by the U. S. for stumpage and sale area betterment. Gerson estimated that this volume resulted in payrolls totalling about 11 million dollars during the year.

About 25 per cent of the amount received for stumpage is part of the total returned to the counties each year according to present law.
