Newport Business Gets Shot in Arm As Result of Eisenhower's Vacations

Newport, R.I. — President Eisenhower's three vacations in four years at this seaside resort city have given its juggling economic life a shot in the arm.

Onetime playground of multimillionaires, Newport became somewhat down at the heels after mounting taxes and other inroads made it impossible for even the wealthy to keep up some of the fabulous establishments on the island. But now the tourist business is booming. Plans are afoot for several new motels. The city fathers figure El-

senhower's presence has given the city the equivalent of a million dollars a year in commercial advertising.

Otherwise, Newport residents seem indifferent to Ike's presence at the naval base. Part of this no doubt is due to the fact that this is his third stay — the novelty has worn off.

Another big reason probably is that few Newporters ever get even a glimpse of the President or the First Lady.

The President commutes between his residential quarters at Fort Adams and his office at base headquarters aboard the power yacht "Barbara Ann" to avoid the slow drive through city traffic. It's a quick boat trip across Newport harbor.

Motorists Warned On Construction

Salem — Oregon Highway Engineer W. C. Williams said today that with highway construction at its peak, motorists should be extra wary of highway construction signs because of danger.

Noting that this is the Oregon Trucking Industry's July courtesies and safety campaign period, Williams said that wherever motorists drive this summer they will probably run into some type of road work.

He suggested these precautions:

1. Pay strict attention to "Men Working" and other signs.
2. Slow down on approaching a construction project.
3. Obey the signals of flagmen or others directing traffic.
4. Be alert for equipment crossings.

Californian Gets Oregon Prison Term

Portland — Frederick J. Carter, 53, of Pacifica, Calif., was sentenced to eight years in the Oregon state penitentiary here Tuesday in circuit court.

Carter, who has a long criminal record, was convicted on assault with intent to rob.

Woman's Death Blamed on Bed

Portland — Ellen Charlotte Beatty, 61, was found dead in her apartment here Tuesday, apparently killed by her folding bed.

The Multnomah county coroner ordered an autopsy but it was believed she died of a broken neck.

Employers went to her apartment Tuesday after she failed to report to work. She was found under a 150-pound door to which the head of the folding bed was attached.

Vale Fire Figured At 20,000 Acres

Vale — A forest fire estimated at 20,000 acres was burning out of control near here today.

Bureau of Land Management officials said the fire-fighting crew had been increased to 200 men.

High winds and high temperatures aided the two-day-old fire Tuesday. The fire is in Harney and Malheur counties and has destroyed huge tracts of pine and juniper.

Still another blize was being fought in the Jordan valley.

Cougar Sought in Portland Outskirts

Portland — State and city police have joined forces in a cougar hunt in Portland.

Richard Hanberg, night watchman at the Dwyer Lumber Co., reported seeing the large cat stalking around the mill pond early Tuesday. He said he fired one shot at the cougar but apparently missed. Police said other residents of the area apparently had seen the cougar on other occasions.

State police game wardens used dogs in an attempt to track down the animal. Officers recalled that a similar phantom cougar prowled the eastern outskirts of Portland for three weeks last January, but eluded several hunters.

Billion-Watt Tube Developed

McMinnville — The world's first billion-watt electron tube has been developed by a McMinnville firm, Field Emission Corp., a satellite to Linfield Research Institute.

The product was developed from the fundamental research in field emission at the institute.

Commercial introduction of the new super-powered K-ray machine followed successful use of the device in the nation's largest ballistics laboratories, according to the Oregon Department of Planning and Development.

The tube can look through eight-inches of aluminum or 18 inches of water in one-fifth of a millionth of a second and obtain detailed radiographs of what, to the eye, appears only as a blinding flash of light.

The high-speed, stop-action radiography possible with the billion-watt tube reveals fine details of the impact of a stainless steel pellet on a lead block at 15-thousand feet per second.

Car Equipment Came From Many Sources

Police said they arrested the man while he was sleeping in the stolen car. He did not offer any resistance.

Morrow Land Development Told

Portland — A program for development of a tract of more than 5,000 acres of land in Morrow county, adjacent to the Boardman Space Age Industrial Park has been announced by Gov. Mark Hatfield.

Recreation, wildlife propagation and industrial development uses are included in the program of the Department of Planning and Development for the tract which will have more than 15 miles of frontage on the pool to be formed by the John Day dam on the Columbia river. A large bay will be formed, extending from a point several miles east of the present town of Boardman southeastward to within about a mile of the town of Irrigon.

The program for achieving highest and best use of the area calls for participation by the Port of Morrow county, the State Game Commission, the Corps of Engineers, Federal Fish and Wildlife Service and State Parks Division.

Gardener Comes Up With Something New

Hamilton, Ont. — Peter Buckley thinks he may have accidentally produced something new in his greenhouse.

What he planted as tomatoes have turned out to be green and yellow lemon shaped fruits, and he thinks some hybrid experimental seed may have gotten mixed with regular tomato seed.

Tentatively, before a tasting test, he's calling them lematatoes.
