Eastern Oregon Range Fires Flare Anew

Two Eastern Oregon fires believed under control and in the mopping up stages flared up again Wednesday afternoon.

Flames were blown around an 18,000 acre range fire in Northern Malheur and Harney counties Wednesday afternoon by heavy afternoon winds.

Firefighters were forced back and a call was issued for five borate dropping aircraft from La Grande.

One hundred men were brought in to relieve some 300 men already fighting the fire. In Juntura Region

The fire had spread into Malheur county's Juntura region and was believed under control when it flared up again Wednesday afternoon on the north and west sides, and jumped the line on a high ridge.

Planes from Redmond and Boise sprayed borate on the fire.

Ed Booker, spokesman for the Bureau of Land Management, said the blaze apparently started when a rancher left a smoldering campfire.

Lightning storms Wednesday evening touched off seven more fires in the Jordan valley area. Officials at last report did not know how large the fires would be.

Moves Into Idaho

The fire that started Tuesday in the Jordan Valley area had consumed 700 acres up to Wednesday morning and was also believed under control when it, too, jumped lines.

The fire charred 1800 acres and moved into Idaho and through the pasture of the Jack Dentel ranch when strong winds came up to fan the blaze.

An attempt was being made to get more men to battle the fires. Men and equipment were expected from Prineville and the Baker district.

Boise, Idaho, planned to send men to the fire.

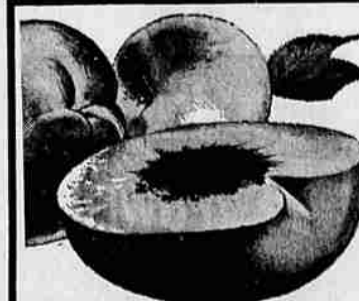
