

### Ecuador Crash Victims Removed

Quito, Ecuador (AP) — The bodies of 12 Americans killed in the crash Monday of a U.S. C-47 military transport were expected to arrive in Quito today.

Six Ecuadorians also died in the crash, which occurred in rugged mountain country 20 miles from here as the plane neared the end of its flight from Bogota, Colombia. Search teams discovered the wreckage Wednesday.

The American dead, including servicemen and their dependents, were:

Col. James E. Sever of Norfolk, Va., the pilot and an air attaché at the U.S. Embassy in Bogota; his wife, Dorothy, and daughter, Julia; Master Sigs. Samuel Nittle of Bangor, Main, and Charles Horning of Ottawa, Ohio; William B. Lynch of Milford, Del., and his wife Marian; John Gremes, 18, a student of Greentown, Ind.; Col. Westley Laney of Daytona Beach, Fla., his wife, Mary, and daughter, Mary; and Maj. Willy C. Stone, co-pilot, of Wylie, Tex.

I suppose you watched your TV Monday night. If you didn't, you missed a good show.

Young Mr. Church of Idaho (aged 35) was the star. He was good. He has all the engaging tricks of the born orator — which, by the way, is how he got his start. In high school, he won a national oratorical contest sponsored by the American Legion. He went on from there to become a member of the youngest member of that august body.

He is handsome. He has a dynamic presence. He has a ringing, carrying baritone voice that hardly needs a loud speaker. His gestures, his smiles, his postures are perfect.

He poured it onto the wicked Republicans . . . as it was his business to do. Later on it will be the business of a Republican keynoter to pour it onto the Democrats.

HMMMMMM. I suppose there must be some creaky-in-the-joints oldsters still living who can remember another boy orator, William Jennings Bryan, the Boy Orator of the Platte. By an odd coincidence, William Jennings Bryan was almost the identical age of Frank Forrester Church . . . 35, when he got his big chance back in 1896. The Boy Orator of the Snake will be 36 come July 25, which is only a week and a half off.

PERSONALLY, young Mr. Church was wonderful the other night. Listening to him was like listening to music. Looking at him was like looking at a movie idol.

But — As a colner of punch-lines — He wasn't quite up to William Jennings Bryan. This was Church's masterpiece: "The Eisenhower administration is giving the country PITCHMAN PROSPERITY at home and abroad in substituting S H O W M A N S H I P FOR STATESMANSHIP."

That was good, and it got cheers. And hand-clapping. But the TV camera gave us a close-up of some applauding hands that weren't CLAPPING. They were just patting.

No one was just patting in Chicago, in that dramatic week back in 1896 when the Boy Orator of the Platte thundered into the ears of the Democratic national convention this rousing slogan: "YOU SHALL NOT CRUCIFY MANKIND ON A CROSS OF GOLD."

THAT did it. It launched William Jennings Bryan on a career. For nearly 20 years he dominated his party . . . although he never got elected.

JUST a thought in conclusion. William Jennings Bryan's recipe for prosperity for everybody was "free coinage of silver at the ratio of sixteen to one." That is just another form of funny money. It was a promise to the unthinking that money grows on trees and under the right political leadership can be plucked off by any and all who need it.

One can't help wondering what William Jennings Bryan would think if he were still alive and able to contemplate the staggering fact that after many decades of promises that money can be plucked from trees if only the right people are elected our national debt has reached the stupendous total of 286 BILLION DOLLARS.
