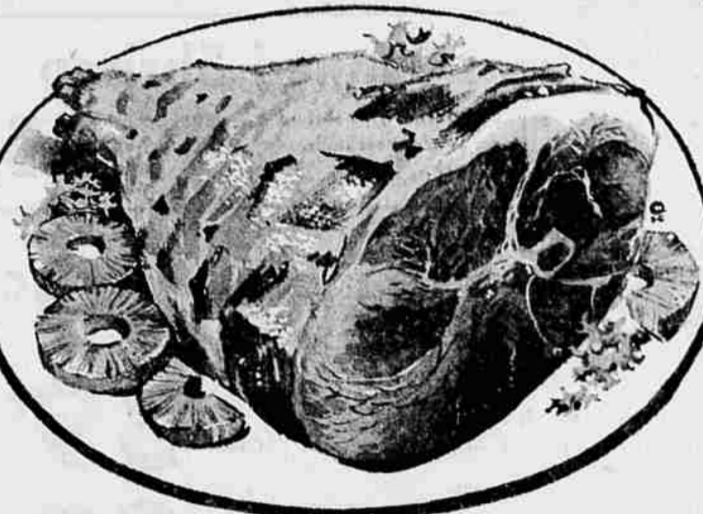


SAUCE SUPREME—Here's a sauce to add a zesty touch to everyday vegetables. It's delicious over broccoli, cauliflower, spinach, or other greens. 1/4-cup butter; 1/4-cup flour; 2 teaspoons milk; dash salt; dash paprika; 1/4-cup onion; 1/4-cup grated lemon rind; small can sliced mushrooms with juice; 2 hard-boiled eggs, shelled and diced; 1/4-cup chopped pickled dill; 1/4-cup mayonnaise. Add milk slowly, stirring constantly, over a low heat, and cook mixture until thick and smooth. Fold in all other ingredients, and serve over low heat for 2-3 minutes. Cool and freeze. To serve, allow sauce to thaw for about two hours; heat in double boiler and stir in 1/2-cup sautéed almonds (these can be sautéed and frozen ahead of time, but should be added to sauce just before serving). Pour over vegetable. (Recipe makes 1 1/2 pint—should not be stored in freezer more than three weeks.)

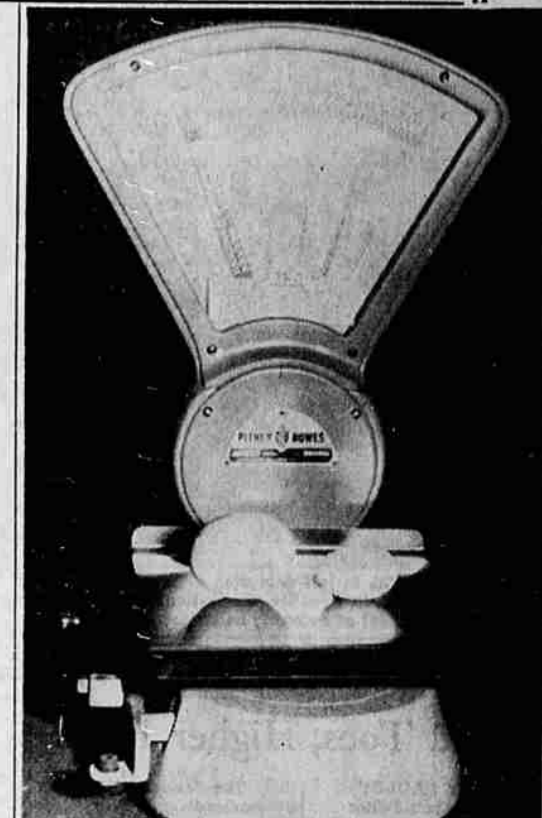

EXTRA LARGE EGG—Shown being "weighed in" at the Mail Tribune is an "extra large" egg laid by an Oregon Red hen belonging to Robert Cook, a poultry farmer in the Griffin creek area. Although most "average" hen eggs weigh about 1 1/2 to 2 ounces, Cook noted, this brownish-colored egg weighed over a third of a pound. It is compared with a "medium-sized" egg borrowed from a downtown restaurant with a possibility of a fourth. Size wise, it is 9/16 inches around the long way, and 9/16 inches around the middle. Legless Men May Be Best for Long Journey Into Space

Washington—(Science Service)—Legless young men otherwise in good physical condition can be trained for space flight and, theoretically, may be better qualified for pioneer space missions because of their disability. However, space flight training program for amputees is not, at this time, either probably or economically practical.

Manned flights as conceived in Project Mercury under the National Aeronautics and Space Administration allow the astronaut to use his hands to work instruments. His legs are not used because of both lack of space and lack of need for them.

In extended flights, man will be traveling for long periods under conditions of zero gravity. There are medical indications that leg muscles may become weak from not being used. Under weightless conditions, it is the upper part of the body which is necessary for movement and stability.

Col. Stapp observed that amputees are constantly in a stressful condition and daily living presents them with the challenge of both physical and psychological adjustment on a continuing basis. "This may make them better able to adjust to the stresses and strains of a space venture than able-bodied men," he indicated.

A double amputee, an Australian veteran of World War II, who obviously was aware of the limitations put upon a legged man in space, has already volunteered to Col. Stapp for astronaut training. However, he had no background of aviation medicine. "His only qualification was being a double amputee," said Col. Stapp, "and, therefore, we had to send him out to learn along with our commitments for his courage in volunteering."

It takes from a year to 18 months to turn a qualified jet pilot into an astronaut with the medical backgrounds to understand the conditions anticipated by space flight medical authorities. Col. Stapp has acknowledged that amputees with flying experience, even lack of other necessary qualifications, could be suitable trainees for space flight.
