### Italian Municipal Elections To Bring Test of Feelings

Rome—AP—An estimated 32 million Italians will go to the polls in October to elect city councils, and politicians already have started worrying.

The municipal elections will be the first nationwide test of the voters' feelings since the general elections of 1958. Political confusion and dissensions inside the anti-Communist camp have in the meantime increased to the point that the ruling party does not appear to have a policy line at all.

Standing to gain from the confusion are the largest Communist party in the free world and the left wing socialists of Pietro Nenni.

The Communists and left wing socialists, still working together despite ideological differences, control one-third of the electorate. In the 1958 elections, the socialists gained and the Communists held their ground.

Although the October elections are only for municipal and provincial councils and not for the national parliament, there was little doubt that they would affect the political picture considerably.

A sharp swing of the vote in any direction could conceivably force new general elections ahead of the 1963 deadline.

The ruling Christian Democrats are bitterly divided among themselves and at odds with their former allies. They are Italy's largest party, but not big enough to govern alone, and cannot make up their minds on an alliance.

**Liberals Shunned**

The middle-road coalition which ruled Italy for over a decade, fighting against both the left and right, fell apart in 1956. The main reason was that the Christian Democrats and two of their smaller partners, the Social Democrats and Republicans, no longer wanted anything to do with the Liberals, a party championing free enterprise which was the fourth coalition partner.

The Christian Democrats, Social Democrats and Republicans have since tried — so far unsuccessfully — to woo Nenni away from the Commu-

### Western Union Asks To Increase Oregon Facilities

Salem—UP—Western Union Telegraph Co. has filed for permission to go ahead with a \$60 million transaction for increased facilities, Oregon Public Utility Commissioner Jone C. Hill said Thursday.

The company is asking Hill to approve a proposed issue of that amount of unsecured promissory notes to cover loans between Nov. 2, 1959 and Jan. 2, 1962.

Proceeds will be used for acquisition of property and construction or improvement of facilities and for reimbursement of funds already expended for the expansion.

Western Union's application cited a two-year total of gross additions to facilities of \$150,700,000, Hill said.

The program includes the world's largest and most advanced digital data system linking 240 U.S. Air Force installations, a "Telex" dial telegraph-printer service for direct two-way communications, a coast to coast microwave beam system and \$51 million in other plant additions.

Hill added that approval of the notes issue will also be sought from other state regulatory bodies.
