

Medford's Legion Nine Entertains Grants Pass; Cheney Studs Vie at KF

American Legion junior baseball encounters are slated on Medford and Klamath Falls diamonds this evening and they may or may not be the last of the season in counting play among teams in Area 4 southern division.

Medford is host to Grants Pass at Cheney field here at 8 p.m., but the important game of the evening is at

Klamath Falls where Central Point Cheney Studs, running second in the loop, and Klamath's No. 1 squad, heading the division, contend at the same hour.

A Klamath victory will give the Pelican city leads the title and send them into area play-offs against the northern division champ, Central Point must beat KF tonight and overcome Medford in a make up mix if it is to gain a tie with Klamath in the final standings and force a titular playoff.

Seek Third Wins

Central Point has four wins and 1 loss against KF No. 2, a non-league member.

Medford seeks its third verdict over Grants Pass in local competition. The Post 15 and Coca Cola club has taken two and GP one in division action between the two.

Klamath likely will have Wally Palmberg on the mound this evening and the Central Point twirler will be Bill Anhorn.

Bud Lowery may be the pitching choice for Medford with Paul Bliska, Denny Walker or Gary Stevens among the GP possibilities.

Art Pollard In Ashland Auto Races

Art Pollard, Roseburg, the Pacific northwest champ, will seek his second feature win of the season Saturday evening at the Ashland speedway.

He'll be among drivers contending in super-modified auto races.

A full program with time trials, trophy dash, heat races and main are on the agenda for racing fans. Time trials are set for 7 p.m. First race, the trophy dash, is planned for 8 p.m., promptly.

Pollard showed his championship form on July 4 at Eugene. He drove to a decisive victory over Ernie Koch, Vancouver, Wash., who had been unbeatable as long as his equipment stayed together. Art is considered a true champion because he seeks tough competition. He likes to race at Ashland because it is his only chance to run against the very fast cars from California.

Could Settle Question

Pollard at his last appearance at the Ashland oval was apologetic because he had had mechanical trouble and was unable to race in the main event. Barring similar unforeseen circumstances, the question should be settled this Saturday as to whether Art can beat the California auto jockeys.

Local drivers are improving their cars with the objective of keeping at least part of the \$1,000 purse in the Rogue valley. Johnny (Tailspin) Jones has brought a new car from Sacramento, Calif. It is powered with a full race Cadillac engine and is a hot machine. Jones will take his first ride in the furious machine at Ashland speedway tomorrow. It could be spectacular.

Since Bob Benefield, Redding, Calif., blew up his Chevrolet motor at the last Ashland event, he has installed a fully modified Pontiac engine in his No. 97. With this caliber of equipment, there's potential for a fast and ramunctious evening at the speedway.
