### Court Approves Two Agreements

Two agreements with the city of Medford were signed by the Jackson county court Friday.

One is for holding city prisoners in the county jail and the other for county employment of Medford Parks and Recreation Director Robert Haworth as county parks and recreation director. Both agreements are effective as of July 1, according to County Commissioner Ralph James.

The county will assume control, custody, security, boarding and be in charge of the general welfare of all prisoners "under sentence of municipal court" when they must be jailed for more than 24 hours. Cost to the city is \$1.45 a day per prisoner. The city will pay all medical expenses.

"We assume it to be of mutual benefit to city and county to have park and recreation departments coordinated by a director," the other agreement stated. Hiring of Haworth includes the administrative services of a clerk-stenographer for one year.

The county will pay the city total charges of \$5,540. Of this amount, \$2,770 is to be paid before Dec. 31 and the remaining \$2,770 on or before June 30, 1961.
