

Planners to View Trees to Determine If Trimming Safe

Medford's city planning commission decided Thursday night to see for itself if some trees bordering a driveway in the eastern part of the city can be trimmed without being damaged.

The trees border a driveway located north of Hillcrest rd., and east of Vernada st. Owners of the driveway and adjacent property, Dr. and Mrs. L. D. Inskip, 2401 Hillcrest rd., would like to rebuild the driveway and have it dedicated as a public street.

Medford's street tree committee, which has already inspected the area personally, has expressed doubt that the trees can be safely trimmed to the required 14 foot clearance above city streets.

Would Subdivide

Dr. and Mrs. Inskip would like to construct an 18 foot wide street approximately 12 feet from the existing drive-

way. In doing this they would leave the trees on a 12-foot wide center strip dividing the two streets.

City Manager Robert Duff said the Inskeeps have indicated that they would subdivide the property when the street rebuilding is approved.

Dr. Inskip said at Thursday night's meeting that he believes the tree branches can be trimmed to the required 14 foot clearance above the street without injuring the trees. Trucks that are over 12 feet high have been using the driveway without difficulty, he pointed out.

The commission elected to inspect the trees itself, prior to its next meeting, Aug. 11. The commission recommended to the city council that approximately one acre of land at the northeast corner of Sunrise and Harrison aves. be annexed to the city.

It was pointed out that this particular area cannot now be adequately served by city sewer services, but can probably be served by septic tanks.

Buildings Proposed

The commission noted that the owner of the property, W. Benton Smith, has proposed to build homes on the annexed area and another adjacent area which is already in the city.

Commission approval was given to a proposed vacation of a portion of the Rogue Valley Heights extension subdivision plat. No one voiced any objection to the vacation.

The commission said that the plat is being vacated to allow for the platting of the Northgate subdivision.

Vacation Request

A request to vacate an alley running east-west through a block bounded by Park ave., Monroe, Catherine and Belmont sts., received commission recommendation.

It was noted that there is another alley that runs north-south through the block, there are no utilities in the alley and it is not used for access to adjacent property.

The council now has to act on the commission's recommendation.

Public hearings were called for the commission's Aug. 11, meeting on two requests for change of zone.

One of the requests is to change two lots located near the intersection of Highland dr. and Siskiyou blvd., from single-family to limited commercial zones.

The other request is to change the property north of the Medford Shopping Center from a single-family to multiple-family zone.

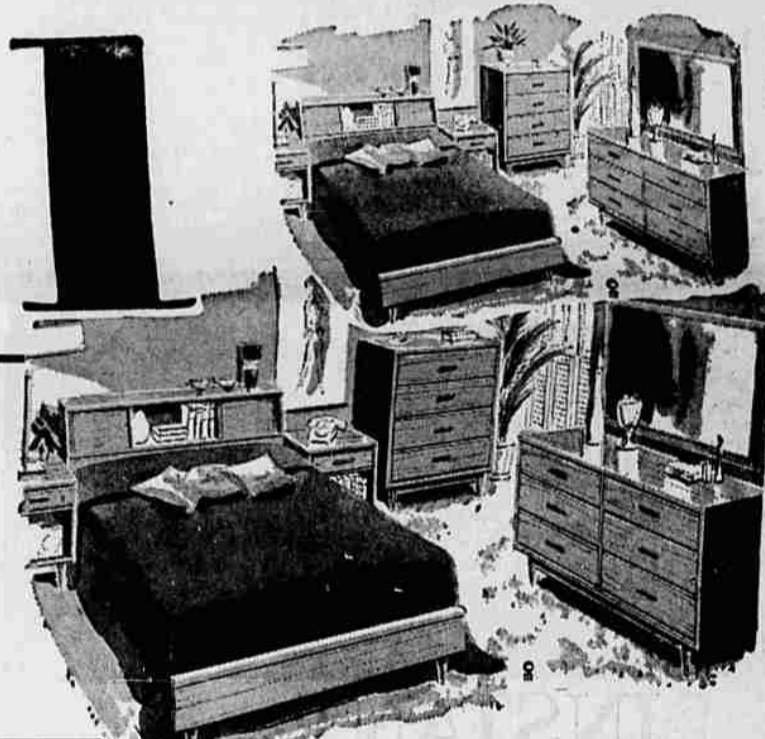

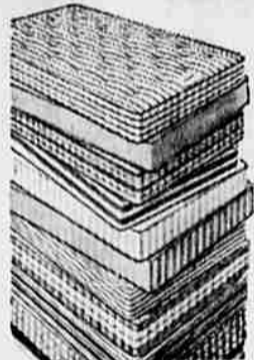

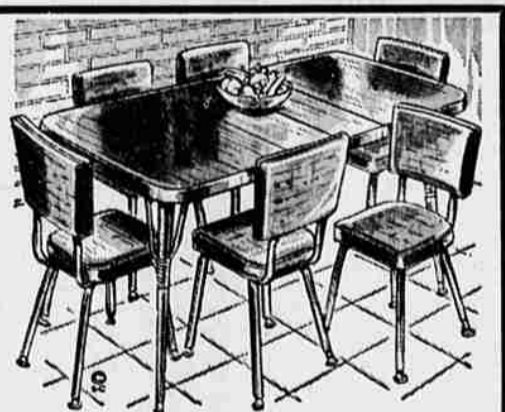
