Oregonian Killed In Plane Crash

Thorn, Calif. — (UPI) — A light plane crashed in a timbered ravine late Saturday killing one man and injuring his brother. The victim was Ivan Alvin Hubbs, 33, of Drain, Ore., who was thrown from the rear seat of the plane as it ripped through trees and down a heavily wooded incline about a mile north of the Thorn airport. Hobe Hubbs, 43, the dead man's brother, was critically injured and was rushed to Garberville, Calif., hospital. Witnesses said the plane went into a spin at 1,000 feet as it approached the airport to land.

Subway Hit by Electrical Fire

New York — (UPI) — An electrical fire flared in a subway tunnel under the East River Saturday night and the thick smoke felled 26 persons.

The transit authority said there were no trains in the tunnel when fire broke out in a circuit breaker but a train near the tunnel entrance was enveloped in smoke. Seven passengers and four transit employees were taken to a hospital suffering from smoke poisoning and 15 other persons were treated at the scene.

San Francisco — (UPI) — A teenage sailor leaped to his death Saturday from a second story fire escape in downtown San Francisco.

Naval officials tentatively identified him as Boiler Tender 3 C. Vernon Tuttle, 19, aboard the USS Midway docked at Hunter's Point here. His home address was listed as 1216 Pennsylvania ave., Kansas City, Mo.

Police said he apparently made his way up the fire escape from the street. An illegible note was found on the body.

Finch Trial to Resume Monday

Los Angeles — (UPI) — The retrial of Dr. R. Bernard Finch and his mistress, Carole Tregoff, on charges of murdering the wealthy doctor's wife, will get under way here Monday.

The first sensational trial which drew reporters from throughout the nation ended in a hung jury. Selection of a panel for the retrial took two weeks and a list of more than 240 prospective jurors.
