Indianapolis - (UPI) - Chris Von Zaltza, Lynn Burke and Ann Warner, the triumphant trio from the Santa Clara Swim club, were set today to lead the nation's top women swimmers into the Olympic trials.

Miss Von Zaltza, who sets a record virtually every time she competes officially, won the 200 meter freestyle Sunday in the meet and American record time of 2:15.1. She was so far in front at the halfway mark that she coasted in.
