Ike Debates Eagerly With Advisers, Says Former Close Associate; Spot Decisions Often Quiet Participants

Washington—(UPI)—President Eisenhower was pictured by a former close associate Sunday as a man who eagerly jumps into debate with his advisers, sometimes deciding an issue on the spot to quiet heated participants.

This inside view into secret meetings of the National Security Council was given to a Congressional subcommittee by Brig. Gen. Robert Cutler, former presidential assistant for national security affairs.

Cutler said Eisenhower "almost always entered into debates and asked questions, referring out answers and listening with greatest interest, turning his head from one side to the other as they debated around him."

"He intervened at times to precipitate the decision... I understand... that the President has participated in more than 90 per cent of all the council meetings held in his administration.

"Vigorous Man" "Those of you who know Dwight D. Eisenhower at all must know what an extraordinarily vigorous man he is. When he participates, he participates. He doesn't just sit."

Cutler gave the testimony in a closed session of the Senate subcommittee on national policy machinery headed by Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D-Wash.).

Statements about Mr. Eisenhower's role in council meetings were in response to a question by Edmund E. Pendleton, council for Republican members. Some critics have contended that the President has been sheltered by the council from the debates preceding important policy decisions.

Flexibility Cutler said one President may use the council in a different way from another President, therefore, he urged the Senators not let the council's flexibility get "embedded in legislative concrete."

Senator Says Government 'Incredibly Confused' On Release of Information

Washington—(UPI)—Sen. Thomas C. Hennings Jr. (D-Mo.) said Sunday that "incredible confusion" exists among federal officials about what government information they legally can withhold from the public.

Hennings in an attack on government secrecy recommended passage of comprehensive "right-to-know" legislation to bring "some order out of this chaos."

Engineer Reports On Road, Bridge Construction

A number of bridge and road projects included in the county roads department work schedule this year are either under construction or have been completed, according to County Engineer Bob Carstensen.

Briggs completed so far include those on Upton rd., two on Gregory rd., West Evans Creek rd., and three on Carberry rd. The bridge on Evans Creek rd. is completed except for surface finish, Carstensen said.

Briggs under construction or contract are South Fork Rogue river, Laurelthrust rd., and one on Willow Springs rd.

Grading, oiling and paving has been completed on Madrona lane, Ashland Climax rd., and Riley rd., he said.

Grading has been completed on the North River rd. from Rogue River to the county line and Riley rd. Still under construction are the Meadows rd. between Snider creek and the summit; Agate rd., between Nick Young rd. and Hog creek; Rogue River dr., and Crowfoot rd.

The county's oiling and paving program is also reported to be well under way. Projects completed include Meadows rd. between Snider creek and Dodge rd.; Dark Hollow, Hillcrest, Lawnsdale, and Gilman roads, Cottonwood ave., Vasil Way, Regar Way, Cheryl ave. in Phoenix, and Cherry lane.
