

# Eichman Caught, But Many Other Nazis Still Hunted

Jerusalem, Israel — On Memorial Hill west of the Holy City, beside the cemetery of Israel's war dead, stands a group of gray-painted wooden bungalows which

form the command post for one of the most dogged man-hunts in the world today. From the metal gate which gives access to these buildings went forth the Israeli agents who brought Adolf Eichmann back to stand trial for crimes against the Jewish people.

About 500 top-ranking Nazis are on priority lists for similar arrest. The list of smaller fry, including some women who were guards in Nazi death camps, adds up to about 1,000.

In rows of metal cabinets lining the corridors of the Israeli foreign office research department are the clues to the whereabouts of these Nazis, still sought for atrocities before and during World War II. The agency receives, from its own representatives and others around the world,

the scraps of information it is hoped will lead to further arrests. What is known to it is collated and published for Jewish organizations and individuals here and elsewhere who are helping in the unprecedented manhunt.

The foreign office's agents are renowned as incorruptible. Some saw Nazi anti-Semitism at its worst; others grew up in Palestine with bitter knowledge that Jews elsewhere were being helplessly slaughtered. All are convinced that no other nation is as determined as they to apprehend the remaining leaders of the Nazi empire.

**Under Surveillance**  
The World Jewish congress, the American Joint Distribution committee and B'nai B'rith in the United States are on the lookout for the missing

Nazi leaders. Once discovered, they are kept under surveillance by Jews throughout the free world, working on their own time and at their own expense, in harrowing memory of loved ones put to death in Nazi Germany.

Eichmann is known to have left Germany for Spain after the war in the garb of a Roman Catholic priest. Other Nazi leaders fled in the same manner. Many went from Spain to South America, where they found cover in the already large German-born and descended population of Argentina.

Others fled to the Arab countries, mainly to Egypt, which welcomes them as a powerful aid against Israel. A number of ex-Nazis hold high positions in the Egyptian army and various ministries.

**Many Others Sought**  
Among those most eagerly sought are:  
Major Viktor Arais — the killer of large groups of Jews in Riga, Latvia, in 1941. Arrested by the British in Germany in 1949, he escaped.

Werner Blankenberg — the head of a department on Hitler's staff; he sent Jews to Poland for extermination. Whereabouts unknown.

Martin Borman — Hitler's second in command and head of his office. Believed to have been killed in Berlin near Hitler's bunker but there is no proof of his death. Rumor has it that he may be in Argentina. One version says he was slain there.

Botmann — SS officer, commandant of Chelmlo, Poland, death camp. Whereabouts unknown.

Theodor Denker — SS officer, in charge of Jews' expulsion from France in 1942, from Bulgaria in 1943, and from Italy in 1944. Whereabouts unknown.

Richard Glicks — SS officer, Gestapo head and inspector general of concentration camps. Disappeared in 1945.

Rolph and Hans Guenther — SS officers. Eichmann's aides in Prague. Whereabouts unknown.

Hahn — SS officer. Head of security police in Warsaw

during the 1943 Warsaw ghetto rebellion and after. Whereabouts unknown.

Hans Haple — SS officer, commissar for ghetto affairs, Warsaw. Escaped from Austrian camp in 1947.

Otto Honsche — official in Eichmann's Einsatz Kommando which arranged mass murder of Jews in Hungary in 1944 under the command of Herbert Krummy. Whereabouts unknown.

Fritz Katzman — organized the destruction of more than 400,000 Jews in eastern Galicia. Reported to have been seen in Egypt in 1952.

Fritz Lange — organized mass murder of Jews in Riga, Latvia. Escaped from British custody in Germany in 1949.

Dr. Mangle — in charge of sorting out victims for gassing in Auschwitz on the basis of those in the right column to the gas chambers and those in the left column for forced labor. Whereabouts unknown.

Heinrich Mueller — SS officer. Eichmann's direct superior. Fled from Hitler's bunker.

Mansfeld — organizer of

Maidanek murders in 1943. In charge of Auschwitz crematoria in 1944.

Novack — Eichmann's transportation officer. Whereabouts unknown.

Professor Horst Schumann — SS officer, conducted experiments in the sterilization of Jewish women at Auschwitz and Ravensbrueck.

Stange — SS officer, commandant of Treblinka camp. Whereabouts unknown.  
Dr. Ernst Wetzel — director of Nazi department for race policy.

## Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a woman's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Emily S. — It's so hard to help Estelle!

Estelle J. — She thinks any job is good enough for me.

Emily S. — I am 24 and have been happily married for the past three years. There are hardly any problems in my life, but I am worried about my sister Estelle, who is nearly 30 and still single.

I'd like to help Estelle meet someone nice — but she is so difficult! She takes offense at the least thing. Once we invited her over to meet a very nice friend of my husband's. But he called at the last minute to say an emergency had arisen and he couldn't make it. Estelle was furious and turned him down when he called her later for a date.

Estelle says she doesn't want any help from me, but I can't see where she's doing so well on her own. She hasn't many dates and is getting old-maidish in her ways.

Estelle J. — My dear little sister doesn't seem to understand that I have my feelings — even if I am single. I'm not ready to go out with just anyone in order to have a date. I'd rather not go out than go with some of the slobos Emily and my brother-in-law think are good enough for me.

The man who skipped out because of an "emergency" had backed out on previous occasions when he was supposed to meet me. Then this emergency he called about was just ridiculous — something about a sick uncle! I don't have to take that kind of thing.

People seem to think because you're single you are just grasping for marriage on any terms. That certainly isn't the case with me!

The Council: Estelle's reactions are quite extreme and unfortunately she is too blinded by the wrong kind of emotion to see how irrational they are.

If she tried to think the situation through logically she would recognize that her sister and brother-in-law would not want to introduce her to any unworthy man. Their ideas about people could be different from Estelle's, but that should give her no cause to feel offended. They are not telling her to marry the men they introduce — merely to meet them and socialize in a civilized manner.

If Estelle were less immersed in her own hurt feelings, she would be in a better position to understand those of others. The young man who "backed out" of a meeting with her on three occasions is probably very shy. Apparently, he finally mustered courage to call her and ask for a date. A warm, friendly response might have led to a pleasant evening, one more acquaintance — and possibly a deeper relationship.

A single woman of 30 tends to think of herself as a rejected person and sometimes takes refuge in aggressive and self-destructive pride. Yet such a woman has probably rejected and hurt the feelings of many men in the course of her life. Estelle should learn to think more of others. Then she will learn to enjoy the company of men and be less quick to give them a low rating.

## SP Would Make Boxcars Available

Mt. Angel — An Oregon Public Utility commission examiner was told here Monday that additional box cars would be made available to shippers through savings resulting from closure of 140 stations on Southern Pacific company's system.

Figures submitted to back the railroad's application to withdraw its Mt. Angel agent indicate 1,421 rail cars could be secured by spending \$856,750 annually.

K. E. Bosanko, SP research analyst from San Francisco, supplied the statistics.

The SP has closed 11 stations in Oregon from 1951 through July 1, 1960. PUC officials said there appears to be no opposition to SP's abandoning the Mt. Angel agency.
