Committee Reviews Tax Credit System

Salem (UP) - The legislative interim committee on taxation Tuesday discussed a tax credit system as a possible means of lowering state income tax rates while at the same time increasing state tax revenues.

Richard Eymann of Mohawk, executive secretary of the committee, said this could be accomplished because the tax credit plan would be more equitable but would also bring more people under the tax laws.

The tax credit would be in lieu of the \$600 exemption now applied.

The committee is considering several plans designed to broaden Oregon's income tax base.

Chairman Clarence Barton (D-Coalition) said it is the intent of the committee to come up with a proposal for tax relief while at the same time raising enough revenue to operate the state government.

Thornton To Attend Meeting in London

Salem (UP) - Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton will represent the National Association of Attorneys General at the United Nations Congress on Crime Prevention and Treatment of Offenders in London, England, next month.

Thornton, president of the Western Conference of Attorneys General, was asked to represent the national group because of his work in establishing a crime prevention program in Oregon.
