

Traps Being Set To Catch Moths

University Park, Pa. (AP)—The U. S. Department of Agriculture is setting 10,000 traps this summer over an 8,225-square-mile area in central and eastern Pennsylvania. Department agents are trying to round up the gypsy moth, a devastating insect that can turn hardwood forests into a shambles.

Phillip M. Schroeder, the area pest control supervisor, heads the trapping expedition, which is being conducted in cooperation with Pennsylvania State University's agricultural extension division and the Pennsylvania department of agriculture.

The moth traps being used in the program are, in themselves, unique. They are hollow metal cylinders which have a fly paper lining. Eight inches long and four inches in diameter, the traps are not exterminating devices, but are used merely to determine the presence of gypsy moths.

Once a moth is trapped in a given area, then the surrounding woodlands will be sprayed with an insecticide.

Fallout Low in South Hemisphere

Washington—(Science Service)—Radioactive fallout from nuclear test explosions is "considerably lower" in the Southern than in the Northern Hemisphere, four Naval Research Laboratory scientists confirmed here.

They said studies of the debris thrown into the atmosphere when nuclear bombs are exploded also showed that air in the stratosphere mixes only slowly across the equator. They compared the amounts of radioactive tungsten-185 and strontium-90 in the air at various times after the 1958 nuclear tests in the Pacific.

The usefulness of tungsten-185 as a tracer of fallout from the Hardack test series is rapidly nearing an end because most of the element's radioactivity has disappeared. The report on radioactive contamination of the atmosphere in Science is made by Drs. L. B. Lockhart Jr., R. L. Patterson Jr., A. W. Saunders Jr. and R. W. Black.

Devices May Lower Television Costs

New York—(Science Service)—The little radio was made of two tiny new devices called "compactrons," yet it sounded as good as a fair-sized table radio.

Shown to reporters here, the radio was compared favorably with a five-tube radio. It was said to surpass a seven-transistor radio.

The compactron is a tiny, single unit that can perform electronic functions now done by as many as three separate electron-control devices. Company engineers said the devices' multi-function operation and small size would help make color television less bulky and less expensive. Ten compactrons could replace 15 tubes and three diodes or 24 transistors and 11 diodes used in modern sets.

The compactrons, which look like conventional tubes, are now in pilot production in Owensboro, Ky.

Powerful Magnet Planned for Lab

Washington—(Science Service)—A new national research facility containing the world's most powerful magnet will be built at Cambridge, Mass., for study of the fundamental properties of matter at temperatures near absolute zero, which is 459.7 degrees below zero Fahrenheit.

The Massachusetts Institute of Technology will operate the facility under a multi-million dollar contract with the Air Research and Development command of the Air Force. The Air Force announced the project as a step to fill a void in the facilities available to the scientific world for extremely high, continuous magnetic fields.

The laboratory is expected to be completed in 1964. An initial investment of \$5.6 million for construction and management of the program will be made during the Federal fiscal year 1961.

Soap Said Harmless To Eczema Sufferer

Chicago—(Science Service)—Eczema patients may use ordinary toilet soap without fear of making their skin disease worse, five Cleveland physicians report after a one-year study of 250 patients with four different kinds of skin rashes. Drs. Richard B. Stoughton, Lew W. Potts, William Clendenning, Stuart Fisher and Morton Kress, University hospital, collaborated on the report, which appears in the Journal of the American Medical Association.
