

Treasury Secretary Emerges As Dark Horse for Second Place on Republican Ticket

Chicago - (AP) - Treasury Secretary Robert B. Anderson, an Eisenhower Democrat from Texas, emerged Wednesday as a new dark horse possibility in the Republican vice presidential sweepstakes.

At the same time, the Democratic choice of Sen. John F. Kennedy as presidential nominee appeared to have put a big crimp in the GOP presidential chances of Labor Secretary James P. Mitchell who, like Kennedy, is a Catholic.

Informed political quarters bracketed Anderson with three others - U.S. Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge Jr., Sen. Thurston B. Morton of Kentucky and Interior Secretary Fred A. Seaton - as leading contenders for the No. 2 spot on a ticket headed by Richard M. Nixon.

This assumes that Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York sticks by his determination not to be Nixon's running mate. Lodge and Morton were considered to be the front-runners.

Not Mentioned

Perhaps significantly, Mitchell's name was omitted from the list. This did not imply any religious prejudice. On the contrary, some political realists theorized that for the Republicans to put a Catholic on the national ticket to offset Kennedy might be construed as such an obvious ploy for the Catholic vote as to offend many voting groups, especially Catholics.

This does not necessarily rule out Mitchell who has said he is available for the vice presidential nomination. Among the GOP hopefuls, he would be likely to have the strongest support from organized labor.

A native of Elizabeth, N.J., the 59-year-old Mitchell also would fit the geographical need on a ticket headed by Nixon, a Californian. But it was felt that the events in Los Angeles last week dimmed his star.

Appeals to South

Conversely, Anderson's chances got an extra boost.

Anderson, just turned 50, is considered one of the "bright young men" of the Eisenhower administration. The fact that he, like Democratic vice presidential nominee Lyndon B. Johnson, is a Texan was viewed as adding to his appeal in the South as a Nixon running mate.

Highly respected in the business community, Anderson has been one of the top ad-

ministrators in the Eisenhower years - first as a member of the National Manpower commission, then as civilian aide to the Army secretary, Navy secretary, deputy defense secretary and, since July 29, 1957, treasury secretary.

Anderson testified Tuesday before the GOP platform committee. A hard money advocate, he inferentially attacked the Democratic platform by warning that interest rates cannot be held down in good times without producing boom-and-bust.

Kennedy Best Lodge

Lodge, 58, long has been considered a top candidate for the GOP No. 2 spot. The handsome Bostonian successfully managed President Eisenhower's first election campaign but, in the process, lost his

Senate seat to the man who last week became the Democratic standard bearer - Kennedy. Since then, he has been U.S. ambassador to the United Nations.

Morton, who will be 53 next month, comes from a politically important border state - Kentucky. He served three terms in the House of Representatives, was assistant secretary of state for three years before he was elected to the Senate in 1956. He also is Republican national chairman.

Seaton, a Nebraskan, has been a charter member of the Eisenhower administration - first as assistant defense secretary, then as administrative assistant and deputy assistant to the President and, since May 28, 1956, as interior secretary. He will be 49 Dec. 11.

Owners of Boats Warned to Obey Oregon Laws

Salem - (AP) - The Oregon Marine Board has warned boat owners to comply with minimum legal requirements for operating boats on Oregon waters.

They include:

1. At least one lifesaving device must be carried for each person on board. Also, this equipment must have Coast Guard approval and must be so marked.

2. Fire extinguishers are required on all motorboats, the number varying with the size of the craft.

3. All inboard engines must have flame arrestors on all carburetors.

4. Motorboats 16 feet or longer must have a horn or whistle aboard.

Violators are subject to fines.

President Sends Congratulations For Missile Test

Washington - (AP) - President Eisenhower Wednesday sent personal congratulations to the Navy for its successful launching of two Polaris missiles from a submerged submarine.

Defense Secretary Thomas S. Gates Jr., relayed the president's message to top naval officers and the crew of the

submarine George Washington. Gates said:

"The President has asked me to convey his personal congratulations to all concerned upon the successful firing of Polaris from George Washington today. I also join the President in expressing our genuine appreciation to the many persons, civilian and military, who have en-

abled the Navy to make possible this historic milestone. Well done."

The message was sent to Navy Secretary William Franke, Chief of Naval Operations Arleigh A. Burke, Rear Adm. William F. Raborn, who is chief of the Polaris program, and to the George Washington crew.

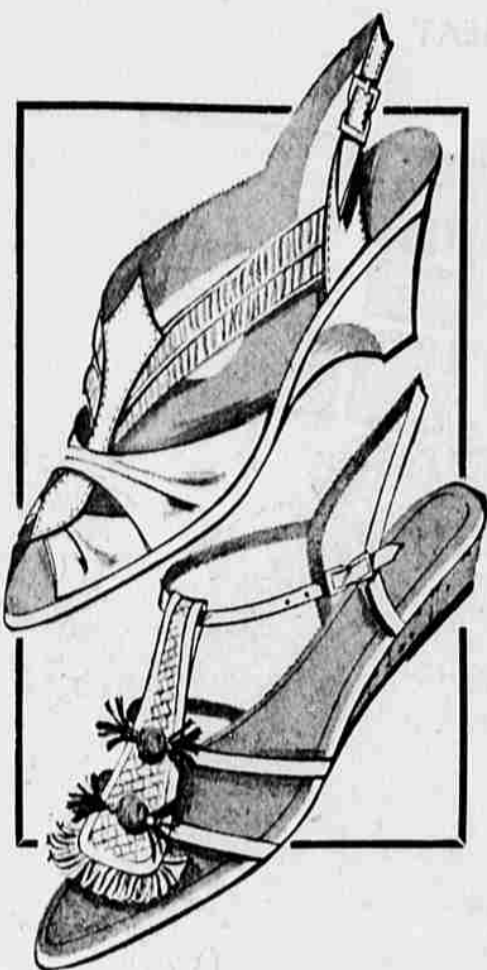

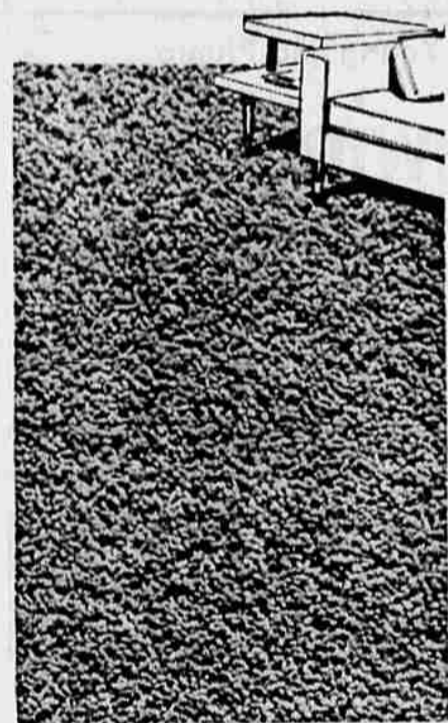
