Don Drysdale Blanks Phillies

Los Angeles (UPI) — Don Drysdale, the big Los Angeles Dodger right-hander, celebrated his 24th birthday Friday and also his first shutout of the year.

Drysdale got his fourth straight victory against the Philadelphia Phillies by a 2-0 score and fanned 14 of the visitors. He was the master throughout giving up only four hits and one base on balls.

The win gave the 6 foot 6 inch hurler a seasonal record of 8-10. His 14 strikeouts equalled his all-time best in this category. Last year he fanned 14 in two games — against the Phillies and the Chicago Cubs.

Dallas Cowboys File Suit Against Player

Seattle Too Roars Home To Victory

Coeur d'Alene, Idaho (UPI) — Seattle Too roared to an easy victory in heat 1-A and Hawaii Kai made it a thrilling come-from-behind win in heat 2-B as they took first day honors in the third annual Diamond Cup race on Lake Coeur d'Alene Saturday.

The two first-day winners, with 400 points each, will be matched in the first heat today at 1:30 p.m.

Hawaii Kai provided the day's major thrills on the choppy lake when Ron Musson brought her past the pre-race favorite, Miss Thriftway, as the two boats entered their final lap.

Musson bore down then for the day's fastest lap as he finished the three-mile course at an average speed of 112.500 miles per hour and fought off a last ditch effort by Miss Thriftway's Bill Muncy.

The Kai's average speed for the five laps was 106.781, nearly a full four miles per hour better than Seattle Too's 102.778 for the first heat. The best lap Seattle Too could manage was 107.356 on its first spin around the course.

Seattle Too led the first heat all the way on the strength of Norm Evans' fast acceleration after the turns. Miss Spokane, with Rex Manchester at the controls, made several efforts to catch the Thriftway on the straightways, but lose out every time on the turns.

McCovey Likes PCL Pitching

Senator, Tiger Hurlers Switch

Washington (UPI) — Pitchers Bill Fischer and Tom Morgan switched uniforms Saturday in a straight waiver deal between the Washington Senators and Detroit Tigers.

Fischer, a 29-year-old right-hander went to the Tigers from the Senators for whom he won three games and lost five this season. He previously pitched for the White Sox.

The 30-year-old Morgan, also a right-hander, compiled a 3-2 record with the Tigers this season. The Senators will be the fourth major league club for whom he has pitched. He also was with the New York Yankees and Kansas City Athletics.

Arroyo Acquired By NY Yankees

New York (UPI) — General Manager George Weiss said today the New York Yankees still were seeking added pitching help despite the acquisition of southpaw Luis Arroyo from Jersey City of the International league.

Arroyo, a 37-year-old reliever, had a 9-7 record with the Havana-Jersey City club. He previously pitched for the St. Louis Cardinals, Pittsburgh Pirates and Cincinnati Reds.

To make room for Arroyo, the Yankees optioned pitcher John Gabler to Richmond, and also reassigned the option on pitcher Zack Monroe from Richmond to Jersey City.

Outfielder Tossed Out

Boston (UPI) — Fiery Cleveland outfielder Jimmy Piersall was thrown out of another game Saturday but the Indians, on pitcher Jim Perry's 11th victory of the season, won a 4-2 triumph over the Boston Red Sox.

Piersall, the heavily-fined Cleveland problem child, was ejected by plate umpire Ed Hurley in the eighth inning and hotly disputed the order, leaving the field 10 minutes later. Manager Joe Gordon and Coach Mel Harder were ejected with Piersall.

Jimmy was being tossed out for the sixth time this season after being tagged with fines by both the American league and the Indians and ordered to take several days of rest at home for earlier disputes with the umpires.

Ted Williams and Willie Tashby Held the Rest of the Red Sox in Check to make his record 114 for the season.

The Indians got one run in the first on Johnny Temple's infield hit, a walk and two fielders' choices. Piersall's single, a double by John Romano and sacrifice flies by Mike de la Hoz and Perry produced two more runs, including the clincher in the second.

De la Hoz hit his first major league home run with the bases empty in the fourth.
