



Two Arraigned in Circuit Court on Car Theft Charge

Donald Turner Coleman and Doyle Dunn, two 17-year-old Ft. Ord, Calif., soldiers were arraigned on district attorney's information in Jackson county circuit court Thursday on charges of grand larceny. They waived right to a grand jury hearing.

Ben Day, Medford, was appointed attorney for Coleman, and Robert Dames, Medford, for Dunn.

The soldiers, charged also with being absent without leave from the Army, are accused of taking a car owned by Gary Milton Croucher July 5. They admitted taking a series of cars between Pasco, Wash., and Medford, according to reports.

Marvin Lee Hamilton, 17, of 895 Gibbon rd., Medford, waived right of a grand jury hearing, and was arraigned on district attorney's information. He is charged with entering a Central Point lumber company June 29.

Harry Howard Gray, 59, of White City Domiciliary, was sentenced to four years in the Oregon state penitentiary Thursday on charges of grand larceny. He had pleaded guilty to taking a watch from a Medford jewelry store July 5.

Frances Goodlet, 40, Talent, was arraigned on a grand jury indictment Thursday, and was given until Aug. 1, at 10:30 a.m. to enter a plea on charges of fraudulently obtaining narcotics.

Travis Asks UMC Pledges Be Paid

United Medford Crusade President Richard H. Travis has asked that all contributors who have unpaid pledges to the last UMC campaign payable prior to or during August, send in their pledge money as soon as possible.

The UMC expects to disburse agency checks for the final quarter of its fiscal year Aug. 1, but is \$14,000 short of the amount necessary to have available for the disbursement, according to Travis.

It was pointed out that some rather large pledges which fall due during July are expected to reduce the shortage, but it is doubted that enough money will be collected to make the full payment of \$30,562.50 by Aug. 1.

The Crusade fiscal year begins Nov. 1. Agency allocations are usually paid in four equal installments, the first of November, February, May and August.

Travis noted that the Crusade has met its agency obligations for a number of years. Member agencies have learned to rely upon a certain promised income for each year of their operation in contrast to the uncertain results of individual drives, he said.

Ashland — Dr. Alvin Fellers, dean of students, at Southern Oregon college will be one of more than 100 administrative officers in western colleges and universities who plan to attend a four-day institute concerning institutional research on students at Berkeley, Calif., July 26 to 30.

The institute is sponsored by the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education, WICHE, and the center for the study of higher education, Berkeley.

The institute will be devoted to several aspects of student research — selection; retention and withdrawal; values and attitudes; student society; and research planning. Lectures and informal seminars will cover each of these topics.

WICHE was established in 1953 under an interstate compact and has been ratified by 13 states; its programs makes possible the interstate use of specialized graduate and professional programs, thus helping the western colleges and universities to build high quality educational programs and avoid unnecessary duplication.

Dr. Dorothy Knoell, consultant in higher education, California department of education, and Dr. Dean McHenry, of the University of California will be among the featured speakers.
