The bride was employed as secretary of the Eagle Point school district. Mr. DeMoss is employed by Timber Products company.

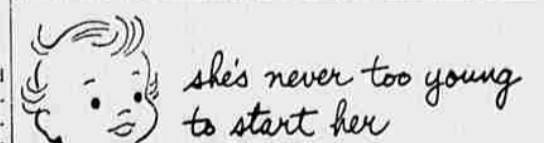
Luncheon Given To Honor Three
