### Neither Navy Ship Had Right of Way

Long Beach, Calif. — (UPI) — The commander of the USS Ammen said Saturday that neither destroyer had the right of way when he first saw the USS Collett bearing down on his ship.

Lt. Cmdr. Zaven Mukhalian, 41, made the statement before a board of inquiry into the collision of the two destroyers that killed 11 of the Ammen's crewmen Tuesday in the fog off Newport Beach, Calif.

The hearing recessed at noon and will resume Monday.

The skipper of the newly-refitted Collett, Lt. Cmdr. Albert T. Ford, questioned Mukhalian about which ship — under the unwritten rules of the sea — should have given way.

"When I saw the Collett," Mukhalian answered, "it was a condition of 'extremist' in which no ship would have had the right of way."

Mukhalian, who was taking the war-proud Ammen to San Diego for deactivation, testified he was proceeding at 12 knots in the fog with his fog whistle blowing.

Ford, taking the Collett on one of her first shakedown cruises with a green crew after six months in drydock, testified he was going about 20 knots — building up steam for a full speed test.

### HOLD 'CORDIAL TALKS'

Tokyo — (UPI) — Communist China's top leaders had "cordial talks" Sunday with guests from Latin America and Africa, the New China News Agency reported. Party Chairman Mao Tse-tung, President Liu Shao-chi and Premier Chou En-lai met with groups from Bolivia, the Congo, the Sudan in the Mall Federation and Zanzibar, the agency said.

### ROOF COLLAPSES

New York — (UPI) — The roof and a side wall of a frame church collapsed Sunday only a few minutes after the end of the morning services. About 45 persons had attended the services, but all but about 12 had left when the collapse occurred. None of the 12 was injured.

### EXPENSIVE CAR

London — (UPI) — An hour after he purchased a car for \$79.80 Charley Hurley was fined \$22.40 for driving an uninsured and unroadworthy automobile. An hour after that Hurley sold the car for junk for \$14.

### Mansfield Promises Lengthy Sessions

Washington — (UPI) — Senate Democratic whip Mike Mansfield of Montana warned electioneering lawmakers Saturday to prepare for night meetings and six-day-a-week sessions when congress returns to work next month.

He said a tentative legislative timetable calls for early consideration of a minimum wage bill sponsored by Democratic presidential nominee Sen. John F. Kennedy when the Senate reconvenes Aug. 8. The House returns to work a week later, on Aug. 15.

The compressed post-convention session faces a "come early and stay late" work schedule, Mansfield told United Press International, with possible night sessions and some Saturday meetings.

Mansfield forecast that Congress will stay until Labor Day, Sept. 5, despite hopes voiced by candidate Kennedy for a session ending by Sept. 1. That is the day Kennedy plans to formally kick off his campaign for the White House.

### World's Nudists Open Convention in Denmark; 'We Have Nothing to Hide'

By PALLE NORLING United Press International Solbakken, Denmark — (UPI) — Bathing suit manufacturers would be mortified if they happened to look in on the Seventh International Congress of Naturists which opened Sunday.

"There's nothing so unpleasant or unhealthy as a dripping wet swim suit," said Eric Aggernas, vice chairman of the Danish nudist movement. Aggernas and several hundred of his friends took off their clothes Sunday and launched a world-wide convention of nudists.

The Danish Naturist Movement has thrown open the gates of its five-acre estate at Solbakken (Sunny Hill) to an estimated 700 sun worshipers who gathered for the six-day meeting which will include the first "naturist Olympic games" since the ancient Greeks.

Olympic Traditions "We are proud to be the first to revive the genuine Olympic traditions by competing in events in the nude like the noble Greeks," said Aggernas.

Nudists from Canada, France, Spain, Greece, Sweden, the United States and several other countries — including some Germans who came by kayak — are participating in the convention.
