**Planes to Air TV Programs**  
 Baltimore, Md. -- (Science Service) -- Two planes will be equipped to transmit television signals to a six-state midwest area under a contract announced today. The system will be the world's first airborne educational TV system.

The Midwest Council on Airborne Television Instruction awarded the \$2.2 million contract for equipment to the Westinghouse Electric corporation here. The program, scheduled to get under way next Jan. 30, will be beamed to Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, Michigan and Wisconsin.

Equipment for each plane will include two television transmitters capable of broadcasting signals to schools within a radius of 150 to 200 miles. When in service, a plane will circle at an altitude of 23,000 feet in the vicinity of the community of Montpelier in north central Indiana.

The transmitters will function as individual television stations in the air, broadcasting from two different channels or frequencies.

**Company Constructs Atomic Incinerator**  
 San Jose, Calif. (Science Service) -- Safer and more economical waste disposal is being accomplished by an "atomic incinerator" installed by General Electric in its nuclear equipment plant here. Before its installation this spring, burnable contaminated material at the plant was encased in concrete and dumped in special burial grounds. With the incinerator in one hour 100 pounds of waste material can be reduced to a small pile of ashes which may be disposed of easily, cutting disposal costs by 75 per cent, according to company spokesmen. Designed by GE's Atomic Power Equipment department, the incinerator has an automatic safety shut-off and is equipped with a filtering system which prevents the escape of radioactive particles from the high-temperature furnace.
