

Nixon's Specifications for Running-Mate Listed; Conservatives Cold-Shouldered

International Amphitheater, Chicago 679 - Richard M. Nixon's own specifications for the vice presidential nominee with whom he will share the 1960 Republican ticket are these:
- He must agree with Nixon.
- He must be a good campaigner.
- He must be capable of dis-

charging executive assignments of greater scope than those assigned to Nixon by President Eisenhower.
- He need not conform to any geographical specifications.
Nixon has been telling his friends for months that there is no political significance in geography; that it is foolish to believe a presidential ticket must be balanced east and west, north or south.
Nixon is firmly against another balancing act. To balance the Republican ticket with a Roman Catholic as

the vice presidential nominee would be, Nixon has insisted, a crass thing. He thinks the public would resent it.
Pulls Squeeze Play
On platform, Nixon expressed the opinion before the Democrats met that the Democratic platform would cover the waterfront; contain everything, something for everyone. Nixon was not far off on that. He predicted pressure on the Republican platform makers to duplicate for the GOP the waterfront coverage of the Democrats.
Nixon was not far off on

that, either. In cahoots with Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York, Nixon effected a squeeze play last week on the Republican platform drafters. The pressure he predicted was exerted on the Republican platform committee, sure enough, and Nixon turned up as one of the pressure group.
There will be conservatives in the Republican party who will be referring to Friday, July 22, as Black Friday. That was the day on which Nixon and Rockefeller met in New York to tailor the Re-

publican platform in some degree to the Democratic pattern.
Republican conservatives are complaining that they get no more consideration in the party of their fathers than Southerners get in the Democratic party. The left wing and the Negroes have more political oomph in both parties than do the conservatives.
Against Right Wingers
Rigged or not, this Republican convention, like the Democratic convention, is

locked against the right wingers.
The right wingers in both parties are beginning to feel disenfranchised. Like residents of the District of Columbia or persons who are insane. It isn't that they may not vote, but that they have no one of their political faith for whom to cast their ballots.
The conservatives cannot do much about that except to holler, scream and shout. Stand by, friends, for some hollering, screaming and shouting this evening when

Sen. Barry Goldwater of Arizona is recognized to speak to this convention.
The word is that Goldwater will get an ovation, and he probably will. But for that faint and still problematical blast of protest, there are no
