Nixon Plans Include Lots of Photographs

Chicago — (UPI) — Vice President Richard M. Nixon set out Tuesday to be photographed shaking hands with almost every one of the 2,800 delegates and alternates to the GOP convention.

His aim, he said, is a picture "with every one of the delegates and alternates, individually."

The pictures were snapped during Nixon's rounds of the various state delegations.

Calling the project "pre-emptive shattering," Nixon said the pictures will be forwarded to state GOP leaders who will make identifications and distribute them.

Nixon told Michigan and delegates the schedule called for a photo every four to six seconds.

Chicago—President Eisenhower, acknowledging an eight-minute ovation at the Republican National Convention: "There is no individual who has been in political life for five minutes who hasn't felt at times discouragement and disappointment. But such a demonstration as you have given my wife and I... is indeed a tribute that warms our hearts."

Chicago—Vice President Richard M. Nixon, telling delegates that his schedule for being photographed with every delegate at the GOP convention called for a photo every four to six seconds: "If you don't believe it, just watch that assembly line when it starts."

United Nations, N.Y.—U. S. Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge, presenting photographs to back up his charge that Soviet planes and vessels carry out espionage missions within five miles of U.S. territory: "We shoot their planes with cameras. They shoot with rockets."

Evansville, Ind.—Police Chief Darwin Covert, expressing confidence that crowds at a forthcoming jazz festival could be handled despite the disturbances that forced cancellation of the Newport, R.I., festival earlier this summer: "We think we can handle jazz fans as easily as we handle basketball fans."

Medford police Monday informed officials of Gilman's Dairy Farm Inc., that the company would have to stop operating a sound truck that plays music on their local ice cream sales deliveries.

Police told company officials that a sound truck for advertising purposes is in violation of a city ordinance. Company officials admitted that the truck had been in operation for the past three days and said they would not use it again until they had talked the problem over with city officials.

New Law Extends Time of Obtaining Veterans Loans

World War II veterans have two more years in which to obtain Veterans administration-guaranteed home, farm and business loans as the result of a bill signed into law July 14, 1960, by the President, S. T. Brannock, contact representative, VA Domiciliary, White City, said today.

Under the same law, both World War II and Korean Conflict veterans can continue to apply for direct loans from the Federal government if they live in designated rural areas where GI loans are not obtainable from the local lending institutions.

The new law authorizes Treasury Department advances of \$150 million in each of the next two years of this district loan extension program.

New Expiration Date
New expiration date for the guaranteed loan program for World War II veterans and for the direct loan program for both World War II and Korean veterans is July 25, 1962. The prior deadline for both programs was July 29, 1960, Brannock stated.

Since it was started in June, 1944, the GI loan program has guaranteed more than five million loans to World War II veterans, totaling approximately \$41 billion, and to 775,000 Korean veterans, amounting to nearly \$9 billion.

Since direct loans were first authorized in July, 1950, the VA has made 185,000 direct loans totaling \$1.3 billion in rural areas and small towns where veterans could not secure loans from local lending facilities. Jackson county has always been a heavy direct loan area, Brannock said.

While both World War II and Korea veterans may now apply for direct loans through July 25, 1962, Korea veterans may continue to seek VA-guaranteed loans through Jan. 31, 1965, through previous legislation.

Remains Unchanged
The GI loan interest rate of 5 1/4 per cent remains unchanged by the new law.

The new law will require that earnest money deposits veterans make be placed in trust accounts so that they will be safeguarded in case the builder becomes insolvent, Brannock stated.

Another provision will allow the VA to guarantee a loan so long as the application is received prior to the new terminal date. Formerly, the law provided VA had one year

New York (UPI) — If your profit margins have been thinning recently, you have plenty of company, says Prudential-Hall in its weekly report on business.

Increasingly rough competition is keeping most prices in line, squeezing margins and shaving profits, the firm adds.

Initial second quarter reports suggest that pre-tax corporate earnings are likely to run about \$1 billion below the \$48 billion annual rate of the first three months of 1960, it says.

Richard T. Leahy of J. W. Sparks and company suggests traders look into the upside potential of Martin company, a stock which recently recorded a new high in the face of a declining market. "It appears that Martin may well be seeking the higher levels

NIXON GETS SCROLL
Chicago — (UPI) — Vice President Richard M. Nixon received a scroll Tuesday from the Hungarian Freedom Fighters Federation which called him "the man best qualified to deal with the Communist enemies of freedom." Nixon told the group he has never had a greater honor than to be associated with the freedom fighters "even on an honorary basis."

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
