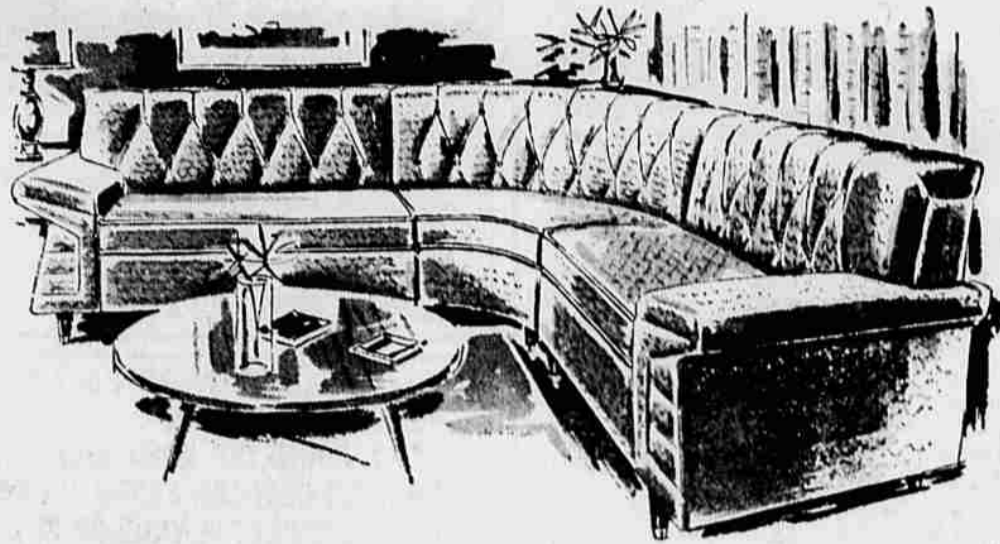
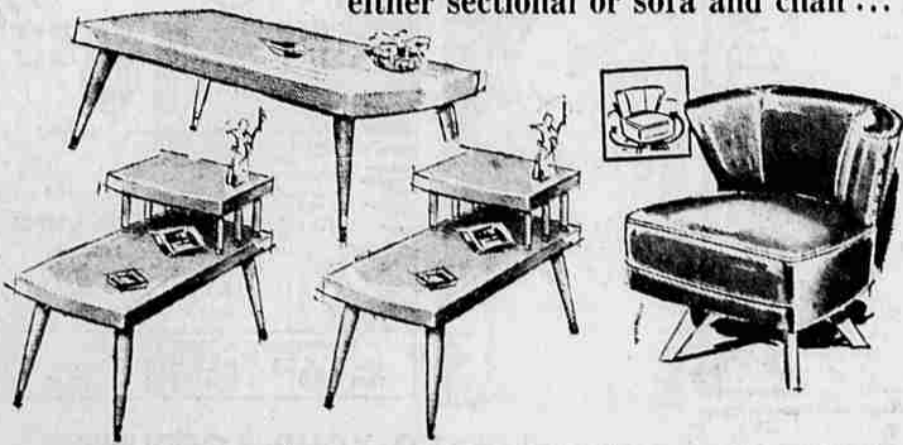

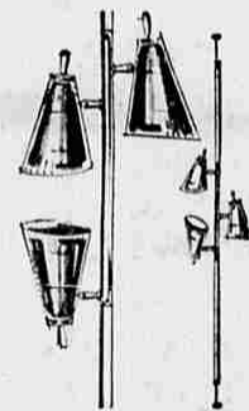

### Conservatives Tongue-Lashed By Goldwater

International Amphitheatre, Chicago (AP) - The conservatives of America got a tongue-lashing Wednesday night from the arch conservative of them all.

He accused them of having thrown the country on past occasions to the Democrats - a party "dedicated to the destruction" of America - by sulking at home on election day instead of voting Republican.

He told them not to do it again. He told them to get out and fight for Richard M. Nixon for president even if they do think the 1960 GOP platform is too liberal in spots.

"Darling of Conservatives" It's a lot better, he said, than that "blueprint for socialism presented by the Democrats" at their national convention in Los Angeles two weeks ago.

The tongue-lashing and the exhortation were delivered by the one man whom conservatives adore above all others in public office - Sen. Barry M. Goldwater of Arizona.

Goldwater, a handsome, gray-haired, forceful 51-year-old, has been called "the darling of the conservatives," "a conservative's conservative," and "a right-wing reactionary," he glories in such labels.

If the late Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio was "Mr. Republican," Goldwater, a Republican, too, is "Mr. Conservative." There were those at Wednesday night's session of the GOP national convention, which unanimously nominated Nixon for president, who far preferred Goldwater.

Placed in Nomination One of them, Gov. Paul Fannin of Arizona, defied the senator's personal wishes and put him in nomination. He said Goldwater had won "the admiration of America by his unswerving willingness to call a spade a spade." This touched off a noisy 12-minute demonstration.

Four seconding speeches followed, each praising the senator as a man of integrity totally without fear.

The moment they were through, Goldwater appeared on the speaker's platform. He withdrew his nomination, shushed a chorus of "noes," and asked the Arizona delegation to cast its 14 votes for Nixon.

### Histamine's Role In Health and Disease Studied

Los Angeles (Science Service) - The role of histamine, thought to be associated with allergies, is being investigated in a research program which may lead to a better understanding of this substance as it affects health and disease.

The study is being carried out under the direction of Drs. William J. Hartman and William G. Clark of the University of California Medical School, Los Angeles, and the Sepulveda Veterans Administration hospital.

Drs. Hartman and Clark and their group recently demonstrated for the first time that histamine is produced normally in human cells by an enzyme. It had previously been thought by many to be produced by intestinal bacteria. The researchers used sterile preparations from mast cells, a kind of white blood cell, obtained from patients with acute myelogenous leukemia.

Role in Functions Although histamine is implicated in allergies, acute infections and inflammation, there is increasing evidence of its roles in normal body functions, the investigators point out. These may include nerve transmission, brain and heart functions and production of gastric secretions. Histamine may also be involved in such growth processes as development of the fetus in pregnancy, tissue regeneration and wound healing.

The study is concerned with how the body produces and utilizes histamine in its normal processes. It is also concerned with means of blocking its production in abnormal situations such as allergies and inflammation. Key to histamine production and a focal point in the study is the enzyme, histidine decarboxylase, which manufactures the substance.
