Portland - (AP) - A blueprint argument for retention of Post Office regional headquarters in Portland was drawn up Friday, according to former Governor Elmo Smith.

Smith met here with Thomas Delzell, president of the chamber of commerce, and Robert Carr, director of the Planning and Development Commission, to outline the brief showing why the headquarters should not be transferred to Seattle.

Smith, Republican candidate for the U.S. Senate, said earlier this week. Postmaster Arthur Summerfield had agreed to review the proposed transfer before any move is made.

Mrs. Neuberger Sees Power Famine

The Dalles - (AP) - Mrs. Maurine Neuberger, Democratic candidate for the U.S. Senate charged Friday night that a three year "famine" of new supplies of Columbia river power is in prospect for Oregon as the result of what she termed the Republican administration's "no new starts policy."

Mrs. Neuberger, a candidate for her late husband's Senate seat, made her remarks here at a dinner meeting of Wasco county Democrats.

She declared that "no new federal generation of power is scheduled to come on Bonneville Power transmission lines in 1963, 1964, or 1965." Mrs. Neuberger added.

The study said for the first quarter of 1960, city employees had 34 countable accidents per million man-hours worked. The figure for the first quarter last year was 39. Countable accidents are those causing loss of work time. The study said, however, the accidents this year were more severe than last year.
