

Marion County Asks To Buy Property

Salem — UPB — Marion county has asked the state for permission to purchase nine acres of land near the state hospital here as a site for a proposed county juvenile facility.

The Oregon Board of Control was also asked to approve an immediate survey of the land by the county.

The proposal hinges on a \$250,000 county bond issue which comes up at the November election.

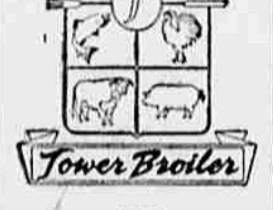
The reproductions are available at the Tudor Guild booth at the rear of the Festival seating area. All proceeds from the sales will go to the actor's scholarship fund.

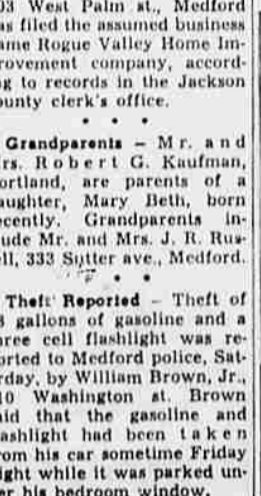
