### Suppose Missiles in Cuba Could Hit Cities in U.S.?

San Diego—(UPI)—What would the United States do if Russia shipped missiles into Cuba capable of blasting American cities?

That question was soberly asked Monday by Lt. Gen. Arthur G. Trudeau at the opening of the three-day conference of the Institute of Aeronautical Sciences.

Trudeau, head of research and development for the Army, left little doubt with newsmen that he considered such a massing of Russian missiles in Cuba a possibility of the future.

**No Exaggeration**

Explaining he did not want to exaggerate the Cuban situation, Trudeau said, "But on the other hand a possible direct military threat from Cuba should not be underestimated."

Former chief of Army intelligence, Trudeau urged, "It is time to stop talking of containment and the status

quo. We may not be at the crossroads, but also we may be very far from our zenith as a military power.

"If the Russians did take such steps in Cuba, the National Security Council and the President would have a great decision to make."

**Shipped in Secret**

Trudeau said he believed that mobile missiles possessed by Russia could be secretly taken into Cuba. However, he said he was hopeful intelligence agencies would be able to give the United States some warning of such a move.

"With the fully mobile missiles Russia now has," Trudeau said, "launching pads could not have to be built in Cuba. The Soviet Union would have the capability of hitting many parts of the U.S."

Such cities as Houston, Tex.; Memphis, Tenn., and "perhaps" Norfolk, Va., would be within range of such missiles.

About 2,000 space-age scientists were attending the conference sponsored jointly by the Army, Navy, Air Force and Department of Defense. Most sessions were because of the classified nature of their subjects.

### Schrunk Requests Study of Stadium

Portland—(UPI)—Portland Mayor Terry Schrunk has asked the city's planning commission to make a comprehensive study of Portland's need for a municipal stadium and the possibility of making it a joint city-Multnomah county venture.

Schrunk said he wants a detailed report made to the city council deal with the feasibility of maintaining Multnomah stadium and exploring the needs of the metropolitan area for the coming years.

The Multnomah Athletic club, owner of Multnomah stadium, has announced it plans to sell the stadium and has given the city the first opportunity to buy it.

Schrunk said it is "inconceivable" that the city of Portland should be without a municipal stadium.

### Florence Adland's Trial Under Way

Los Angeles—(UPI)—Mrs. Florence Adland today stands trial on charges of contributing to the delinquency of her 17-year-old daughter Beverly, the playmate of the late Errol Flynn.

Beverly, now living with evangelist Leonard Eilers and his wife, will testify on behalf of her mother.

"I feel confident she will be a fine and sincere witness," said Mrs. Adland's attorney, Marvin Mitchelson.

Mrs. Adland, 53, a blonde divorcee, was arrested on the charges after a wild wine drinking party in her Hollywood apartment March 19 in which she and Beverly were photographed on beds with partially-clothed men.

Conviction on the charges would carry a maximum of a one-year jail sentence and heavy fine.

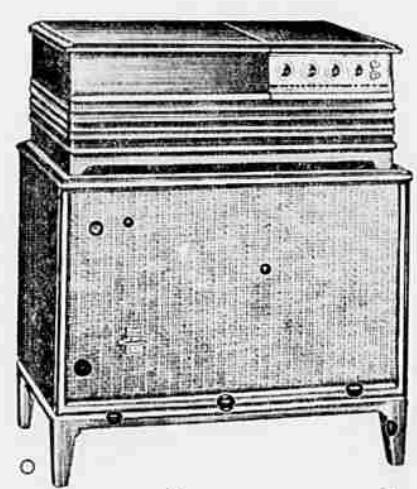

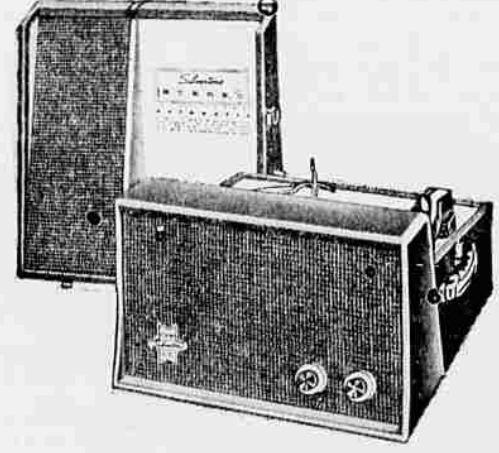

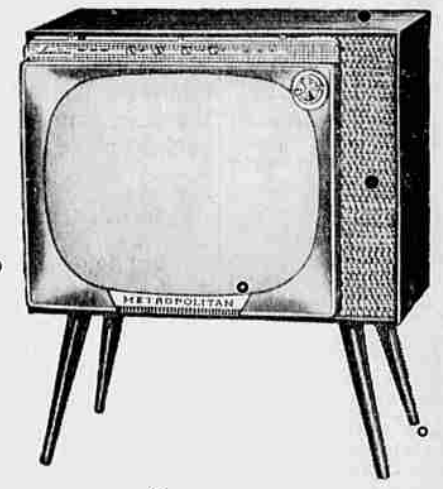
