Construction Starts On New Restaurant

Construction got under way Tuesday on a new Medford restaurant to be called the "Port of Call." It is to be located in the Luman building, formerly the site of the Food Fair grocery store, 236 North Front st.

Owner of the restaurant is Bill Taylor, formerly of Portland and now of Central Point. Taylor said he plans to invest \$200,000 in the restaurant, which, he says, "will be the finest restaurant north of San Francisco."

Taylor said the restaurant will be designed on an international theme and will have a dining capacity for 230 persons. He is shooting for a Sept. 1 completion date.

Some of the features of the establishment will include wall murals depicting the seven wonders of the world; a pool in the center of the main room in the middle of which will be a small fire; copper fixtures and leather upholstery.

The restaurant will serve international foods including sea foods of all kinds. Taylor is also owner of the Captain's Corner restaurant in Portland.
