Delay Asked in Education District

Salem (UPI)—The State Board of Education was urged today by spokesmen from Jefferson and Crook counties to delay a decision on formation of a Central Oregon Area Education District until problems can be worked out.

Representatives from the third county involved, Deschutes, called for an immediate decision.

Taking of testimony in the controversial issue concluded late this morning and Board Chairman S. E. Brogitt of Helix said the board will take "some form of action" this afternoon.

Following the testimony, the board launched a hearing on the proposed Southwest Oregon Area Education District, tentative boundaries are parts of Lan, Douglas and Josephine counties, and all of Coos and Curry counties.

Shakup Looms in Dominican Cabinet

Cludad Trujillo, D.R.—(UPI)—A shakeup of the Dominican cabinet was anticipated today as a sequel to the resignation of President Hector B. Trujillo.

Provisional President Joaquin Balaguer, who stepped up from the vice president Wednesday to fill the vacancy left by Trujillo's resignation, had already replaced two top officials and further changes were expected.

In an inaugural speech, however, Balaguer endorsed the policies of the president's brother Rafael, for 30 years the dominant figure in Dominican politics, and hailed him as "rector of the fatherland."

The president gave illness as the reason for his unexpected resignation, two years before the expiration of his current term in office.

Finch Trial Shapes As Battle of Wits

Los Angeles (UPI)—The second murder trial of Dr. R. Bernard Finch, 43, and Carole Tregoff, 23, appeared to be shaping up today as a battle of wits between a defense attorney and the trial judge.

Now in its sixth week, the retrial has featured heated and frequent clashes between Finch's suave attorney, Grant Cooper, and Superior Judge LeRoy Davson.

The two were expected to clash again today over the main cause of contention—the cross-examination of prosecution witness John Patrick Cody. He was called back for the fourth day of questioning by the defense.

Manipulation Hearing Held

Portland (UPI)—Government-called witnesses testified in U.S. Federal District Court here Wednesday in the case of two men charged with government wheat storage manipulation.

On trial were Earl C. Corey, Portland, and Laurence M. Smith, Waterville, Wash.

Principal witness Wednesday was W. A. Richards, named in a grand jury indictment as a defendant in the present trial.

Richards described a partnership arrangement of the Three State Warehouse Company which he said was headed by Smith, with himself and Corey as silent partners.

Russia Accused Of Illegal Act

Washington (UPI)—The United States today accused Russia of illegally detaining two crew members of the U.S. jet reconnaissance bomber shot down over the Barents Sea and again demanded their immediate release.

In a note delivered in Moscow today, the State Department said Russia apparently decided for purposes of its own to seal off the two airmen "from contact with the outside world in flagrant disregard of international law and practice."

The airmen are 1st Lt. John R. McKone, 38, Tonganoxie, Kan., the navigator, and 1st Lt. Freeman B. Olmstead, 24, Elmira, N.Y., copilot, of the RB47 Air Force jet downed near Russia's Kola Peninsula.

Storms Batter Parts of Nation

Showers and thunderstorms hit the northern part of the nation today and floods plagued parts of the South in the wake of storms that caused at least four deaths Wednesday.

Thundershowers stretched from New England through the Midwest into parts of Montana.

A flood that reached its crest in the Tampa, Fla., area Wednesday led to the drowning of Nita Lane, 14, in the swollen Hillsborough river and caused about \$2 million damage in the area. About 100 families were driven from their homes.

A 4-year-old boy was electrocuted Wednesday night when he picked up a live wire downed in one of the severe storms in Wisconsin.

Bank Robber Seeks Control of Trust

New York (UPI)—Willie (The Actor) Sutton, 60, bank robber and jail breaker, is seeking to gain control of a \$100,000 trust fund he set up to combat juvenile delinquency.

This was revealed Wednesday by Attorney General Louis J. Lefkowitz, who filed in state Supreme Court a challenge of Sutton's petition to cancel the "Willie Sutton Helping Hand Fund" so as to provide for Sutton's daughter.

Sutton set the fund up in 1952 before he was convicted of a \$64,000 New York bank robbery and sentenced to 30 years to life in Attica State Prison where he is now.

Outdoor Manners Council Suggested

Salem (UPI)—A conference of spokesmen from outdoor groups, interested agencies, and citizens voted Wednesday afternoon to request the governor's advisory committee on natural resources to set up a non-governmental council of laymen and others to recommend a program for encouraging good outdoor manners in Oregon.

The conference suggested that Gov. Mark Hatfield make appointments to the new council, to be on a state-wide level.

Hatfield told the conference that despite the effectiveness of such programs as Red Hat Days, "It has been clear for some time that additional means must be developed if we are to reach the minority who continue to flaunt the rules of good outdoor citizenship, good sportsmanship, and safe conduct afield."

Albany Transport Owners Fined

Salem (UPI)—Clarence D. Spencer Jr. and Louise M. Spencer Wednesday were fined \$700 by Public Utility Commissioner Jonel C. Hill for alleged violations of the state motor transportation code.

They operate Independent Motor Transport of Albany. PUC transportation director James Singleton said the charges involved trips between Beaverton and Albany, Halsey and Albany, Portland and Corvallis and Portland and Hampton.

Hill said that in eight other instances cited, Singleton failed to establish proof of any violation.
