

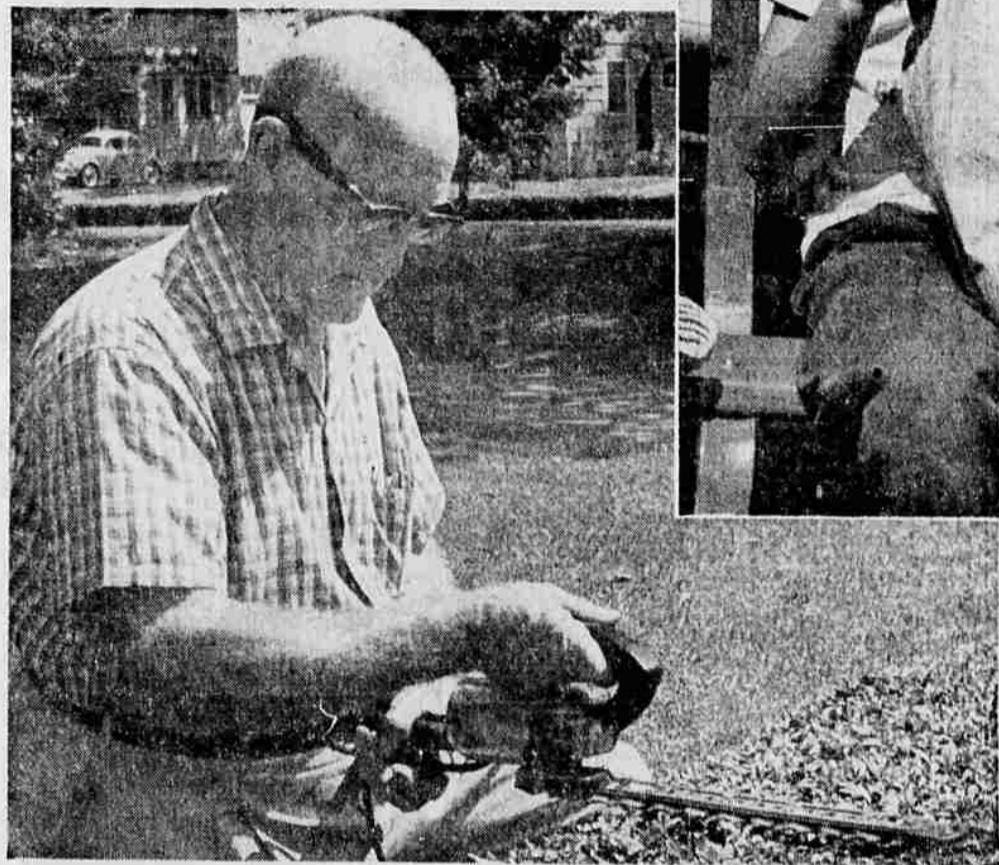
One Summer Morning . . .
