Week End Drags Could Be Biggest

Southern Oregon Timing association's Big Gasser drag races this Saturday and Sunday could prove to be the largest drag event ever held in this section of the state.

Entries continue to come in and from 200 to 250 cars are expected to participate.

Gates open at 8 a.m. on Saturday with time trials starting at 8:30 a.m. Eliminations will be held Sunday with the stock cars being run off at 10 a.m. and the competition classes going to the post at 1 p.m.

Some \$1,000 in cash, bonds and trophies will go to the winners of the meet. Top eliminator will walk away with a four-foot trophy and \$100 cash.

Russia Expects Golden Medals In 13 Sports

Moscow—UPI—Russian Olympic athletes are expected by their leaders to win medals in 13 sports at Rome.

That was the estimate put forth Tuesday by Nikolai Ramanov, president of the Soviet Central Council of Sports Societies, at a press conference extolling the U.S.S.R.'s Olympic prospects.

"A keen and interesting struggle will certainly unfold in Rome," Ramanov told the assembly of Soviet and foreign newspapermen.

He added that Soviet men and women athletes "have excellent chances in 13 events."

Romanov listed these sports as: Track and field, gymnastics, freestyle and Greco-Roman wrestling, boxing, modern pentathlon, rowing, canoeing, shooting, basketball, fencing, weight-lifting and water polo.

UO Olympians Vie Saturday

Los Angeles, Calif. — UPI — Head U.S. Olympic team track coach Larry Snyder says Oregon's six-man contingent all will compete in the last of three Olympic training meets at Pomona, Calif., Saturday.

The group includes Dyrrol Burelson of the University of Oregon and former Duck, Jim Grelle in the 1500 meters, ex-Oregon star Bill Dellinger in the 5,000 meters, another ex-Duck Olin Davis in the 400 meters, Oregon decathlon man Dave Edstrom in the 110-meter high hurdles and Darrell Horn of Oregon State in the broad jump. Horn is an alternate on the team but the others are regulars.

Dellinger, Edstrom and Burelson did not compete in last week's second Olympic team training meet. Snyder says all the Oregon athletes are in "good condition."

Paret-Jordan Bout Cancelled

Portland — UPI — Promoter Tommy Moyer says this month's welterweight championship fight between titleholder Benny (Kid) Paret and former champion Don Jordan at Seattle has been cancelled.

Paret is scheduled to fight Denny Moyer of Portland, Tommy Moyer's nephew, in a non-title fight at New York Aug. 16. The bout will be nationally televised.

Kirk Kerkorian, Jordan's manager, is seeking a court injunction to halt the bout and make Paret honor a return-bout clause in the original title bout contract.
