Funeral services for Col. A. H. Dudley, 65, of Phoenix, who died Friday, will be held at Hillcrest Mortuary chapel on the North Phoenix rd., Monday at 9:30 a.m. The Rev. William Saladin of the Phoenix Presbyterian church will officiate. Committal will be in Hillcrest Memorial park, with Conger-Morris, funeral directors, in charge.

The body will lie in state at Conge-Morris today.

Colonel Dudley was born Feb. 13, 1895, in Prescott, Iowa. He came to the valley in 1932 and was the first livestock auctioneer in southern Oregon, owning and operating the Southern Oregon Livestock Auction company, Phoenix. For many years he conducted the annual 4-H livestock sale in the valley. He retired from auctioneering because of ill health five years ago.

He was a charter member and the first president of the State Auction Yard Owner's association and served on the Oregon State Livestock board for seven years. He also owned and operated the Dudley Truck Line, Inc., a commercial freight line.

He was a member of the Phoenix Lions club, the Phoenix Grange, and the Medford Elks lodge.
