Installment Credit by Banks Celebrating 50th Anniversary

New York - (UPI) - Who buys on time? Nearly half the families in the United States.

Why do they buy on installment plans? Automobiles, furniture, household appliances, and other goods and services.

1800s - in the selling of furniture, sewing machines, pianos and books.

The idea of banks lending money to individuals on the basis of character and income, to be repaid in monthly installments, did not exist until the early 1900s.

In 1910, Arthur J. Morris opened his first bank, Fidelity Savings and Trust Co., to provide character- and income loans to be repaid in regular installments at a reasonable rate of interest.

Today most of the country's banks, as well as other financial institutions and retail establishments, provide consumer installment credit.

Consumer installment credit totaled \$39,482,000,000 at the start of 1960. The average amount of installment credit outstanding in 1959 was \$195 per capita.

This year alone some 10 million new and used cars are expected to be purchased on credit - 4.4 million new cars and 5.6 million used autos.

Automobile loans represent the largest single type of installment credit, followed by personal loans, home consumer goods and other repair and modernization.

Families in the middle-income group are the main users of installment credit - particularly those in the \$6,000 to \$7,500 income bracket.

Consumer installment credit totaled \$39,482,000,000 at the start of 1960. The average amount of installment credit outstanding in 1959 was \$195 per capita.

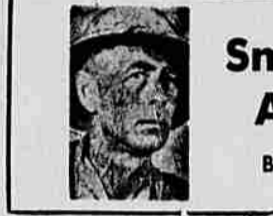

Sealed bids in duplicate for the construction of an addition to Butte Falls High School will be received at the Office of the Superintendent of Schools, at the Butte Falls High School, Butte Falls, Oregon, by School District No. 91, Jackson County, Oregon, until 8 P.M. Pacific Standard Time, Friday, September 2, 1960, and will then be opened and publicly read aloud.

Bids must be submitted in the exact form of the Proposal and Bid Form incorporated in the specifications and provided by the Architect. The addition consists of cafeteria-hand room wing to the main classroom building and the remodeling and additions to the dressing room spaces of the gymnasium building, constructed of masonry and wood frame.

Plans and specifications are on file at the office of Robert J. Keeney, A.I.A., Architect, 310 Medical Center Building, Medford, Oregon; Builders Exchanges in Medford, Portland, Eugene, and Salem; and at the said office of the said School District.

A set of drawings and specifications may be obtained by prime bidders from the Architect upon a deposit of \$25.00. Additional sets of drawings and specifications may be obtained from the Architect for the sum of \$15.00 per set to cover the cost of reproduction. Such additional sets shall remain the property of the Architect and shall be returned to him in good condition after the opening of bids.

Bids will be received on the basis of one contract to include all general construction, including plumbing, heating, ventilating and electrical.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a certified check, or bid bond (with authorized Surety Company) made payable to School District No. 91, Jackson County, Oregon, in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the base bid.

No bidder may withdraw his bid after the hour set for the opening thereof, or before the award of the contract, unless said award is delayed for a period of thirty (30) days.

Attention is directed to the bidder's prequalification requirements or ORS sections 279.012 to 279.024 inclusive, which must be filed with the District Clerk ten days before the date of opening of bids and for which forms may be obtained from the office of the Architect.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a faithful performance and materials bond in the full amount of the contract price as required for a public contract pursuant to ORS 279.510.

The successful bidder shall carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance protecting his employees and also public liability insurance protecting his employees, School District No. 91 and its officers, agents and employees to the minimum amount of \$100,000.00 for injuries to one person and \$300,000.00 minimum for one accident. He shall carry property damage insurance in the minimum amount of \$50,000.00 to protect him, his employees, his officers, agents and employees of School District No. 91.

The usual exclusion of liability under property damage coverage for property in the care, custody, and control of the insured shall be deleted from the coverage required. He shall file with the School District evidence that all such insurance is in force prior to the commencement of any work.
