

**El Mar Avenue Dedication Asked**  
Dedication of El Mar ave., recently received approval from city planners with certain requirements to be met by the developers.  
Requesting the dedication of the street was Dr. and Mrs. L. D. Inskip, 2401 Hillcrest dr., Medford. Dr. Inskip currently has some ten acres of land facing on the avenue.  
The avenue, located north of Hillcrest dr. and parallel to Modoc ave., was vacated about 1920 by the county court and has remained a private roadway, Dr. Inskip said.  
At the present there are several large trees which the planning commission desires to preserve in the interest of public planning, according to group spokesmen. The trees, planted some 20 years ago, have presented a problem to the commission as to the width of street possible and the practicality of sidewalks.  
In accordance to the city code concerning clearance requirements, a one-way grid affair is to be constructed with a 12-foot island in the center. Presently there are some 20 trees in the area, with some 48 trees proposed. They will be spaced 30 feet apart, providing for 18-foot roadways.  
Dr. Inskip recalled that El Mar was used as a right-of-way for the street car tracks, which several years ago led to "Reservoir hill." Necessary improvements will be made by the developers, according to the planning commission.  
El Mar will be designed to resemble the present Glen Oak court, planning commission said.

**Australia Kidnap Victim Found Dead**  
Sydney, Australia—(AP)—Baill Thorne, who won a fortune in a lottery but lost as son as a result, made the heart-breaking formal identification of his kidnaped and slain son's body at the city morgue today.  
It took Thorne five minutes to confirm that the little body with a black scarf wound tightly around his neck was that of his only child, Graeme, 8, who had been kidnaped for ransom which was paid to school July 7.  
The kidnaper demanded \$80,000 from the frantic parents who had won \$224,000 in a lottery shortly before their son's abduction.

**Family Council**  
Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a Judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is the result of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible mental health professionals.  
Estelle C. — Jill should live with her grandmother.  
Victor C. — She must get used to living with us.  
Estelle C. — I have a terrible problem involving my 8-year-old daughter, Jill. Jill was born out of wedlock and I considered giving her up for adoption. My mother, however, told me I'd always regret it if I did. She promised me she would take care of my baby until I was able to make a home for her. Well, two years ago, I married a fine man who wanted to be a father to Jill. We now also have an infant son. However, Jill is very unhappy with me and wants to return to her grandmother. My husband says we should keep her and that I should show her more affection, but I'm not the affectionate type. I can't force it.  
Victor C. — I feel we can give Jill a better home than her grandmother can and that's the important thing. It's natural for Jill to miss her grandmother because she has a baby, but she'll eventually get used to us. Right now, Jill feels out of place because Estelle needs to give so much time to the baby, but I think she should force herself to show Jill more affection. Then she'll see that her mother loves her, too.  
The way I see it, Estelle's mother won't let her and eventually Jill will have to live with us. She'd better get used to it.  
The Council: The difficulty Jill has in adjusting to her new home dates back to the time Estelle was breast-feeding against her own wishes, to keep this child.  
It is true that mothers sometimes regret giving up an illegitimate child, but usually they manage to accept the fact of this loss because they feel they are doing the best thing for the child. It is only fair to give a child the chance to be brought up in a normal home with two parents.  
Once the opposite decision was made, however, it should have been brought home clearly to Jill that her mother loved her dearly and was simply waiting for the opportunity to make a proper home for her.  
As we get the picture, Estelle has never really accepted this child. Undoubtedly she associates her with things the child is not responsible for—the anguish and shame of bearing a child under such trying circumstances.  
Now that Jill is with her, however, Estelle owes it to both herself and the child to make the most strenuous effort to create a proper home for her. And that involves love, first and foremost.  
We think Estelle should try to come to terms with her own feelings, put the past behind her as much as possible and learn to love her daughter. She may have to force herself to show affection at first. When she sees her little girl blossom under this affection and return it, she will know great joy and satisfaction and this will redeem the past.  
But if Estelle finds she cannot make this effort, the child is better off living with her grandmother, who has proved her love. A home with an ideal woman is far from ideal, but it is better than a loveless home.

**Bird Hunting Over Seeded Land Eased**  
Washington—(Science Service)—Migratory birds will be fair game during this fall's hunting season over planted or harvested agricultural lands.  
Effective Sept. 1, the Department of the Interior has relaxed its restrictions on hunting methods because of late fall plantings. Under the previous rules, hunters could engage in shoots only over agricultural land over which seed might have been scattered as a result of harvesting. Unaware of fall plantings, many hunters unwittingly were violating the limited regulation.  
If the relaxation of the rule, just put into effect, causes an excessive depletion of any migratory bird species, corrective action will be considered.
