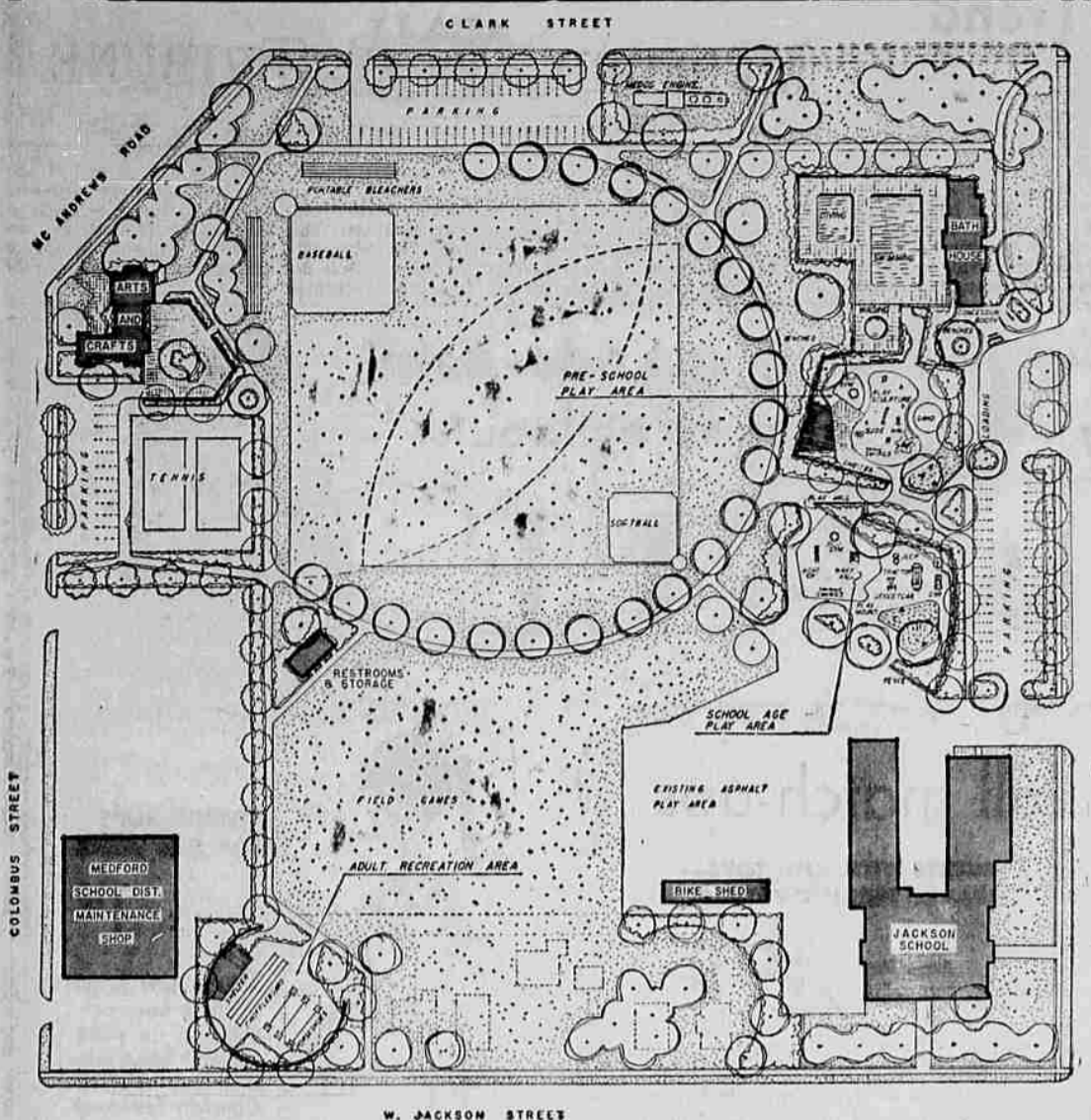

PARK-SCHOOL EXAMPLE—This is an "illustrative example" of a park-school development for Medford designed to accompany a recent Planning for Parks and Recreational report. The report was prepared by the bureau of municipal research and service, University of Oregon, through cooperation with Robert Haworth, Medford parks and recreation director; Ned Langford, city planning director; and other city administrators, to serve as a guide to city planners and the parks and recreation commission in preparing adequate facilities for Medford. Key to the parks program is the park-school development geared to combine the facilities of the city and the school, thus not providing idle equipment. With the coordination of the city administrators and school officials, this example has been provided to show exactly what could be done. The entire park need not be constructed at this time, although initial work

has started along Summit ave. The swimming pool, wading pool, and bath house, as well as the Jackson school play area, comprise what is in the area now. Along West Jackson st. west of the school, the land is now used for homes, thus showing that the proposal is designed for future development. The major factor holding back extensive expansion of the program at this site is adequate funds. No special arrangement has been provided in the financing of this project by the parks and recreation commission. Cost of developing the play areas along the east side would be some \$3,000 according to the planners. How extensive this type of arrangement is carried out will depend on action by the planning commission, parks and recreation commission, city council, school officials, and local residents.

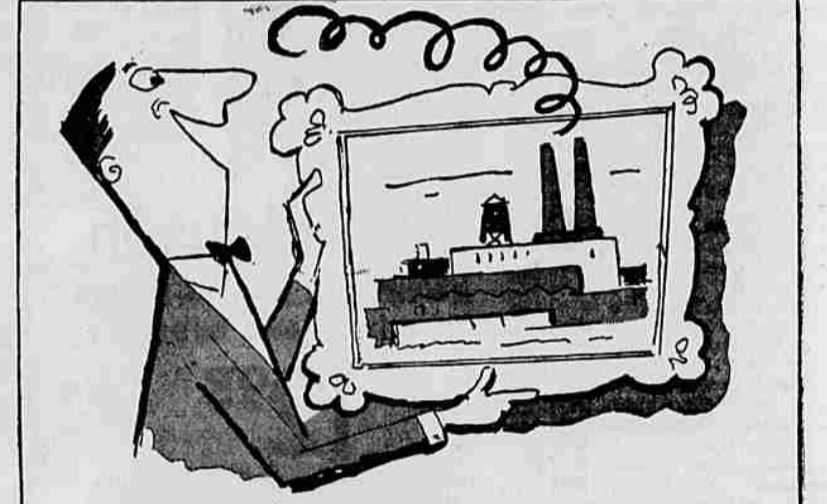
Crater, Phoenix Chapters Win FFA Crop Awards

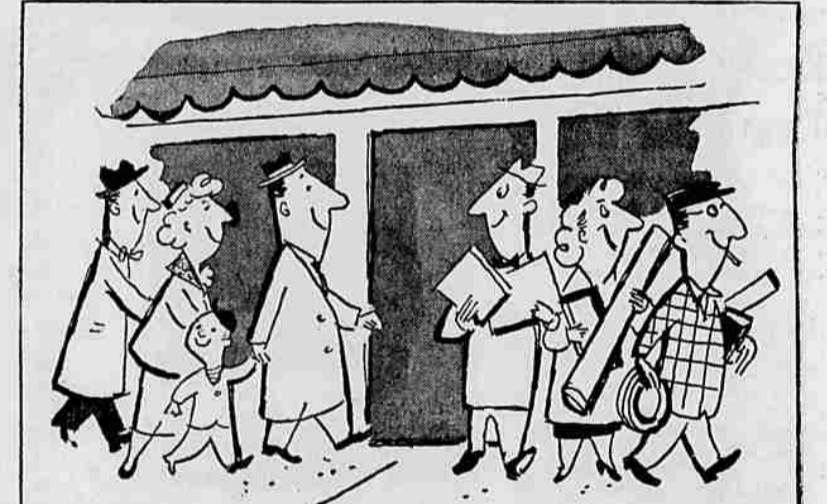
Antelope, Westside Members Win Show
