**Candidate Favors Food for Peace And Medical Year**

Mrs. Maurine Neuberger spoke out in favor of a "food for peace" plan and the creation of an "international medical year" at a luncheon meeting in Medford Friday.

Mrs. Neuberger said that in her campaign for the United States Senate she has found that Oregonians are most interested in the fate of both the nation's prestige and the state's economy.

Mrs. Neuberger, a director of the American Association for the United Nations, is considering offering the Senate a proposal to put surpluses to work as an instrument of American foreign policy.

"When half of the world goes hungry," it is a "tragic loss to have farm surpluses," she said.

The "food for peace plan could help strengthen American prestige by channeling American surpluses abroad," she said. But she did not present this as a complete way to combat Communism.

Rather, she said, it should be presented with a Marshall Plan attitude. The Marshall Plan was designed out of "compassion" for the European countries after the "ravages of war" and as a way to develop markets for American goods.

**Face Facts**

She said that some Republican convention speakers had apparently ignored President Eisenhower's reports on the condition of American prestige. "I would rather face the facts and remain secure" than to continue a "head in the sand" attitude, she said.

Mrs. Neuberger said that she would also support a plan for an "international medical year." She envisioned "a great white fleet" sailing to bring medical attention to countries of the world as well as an exchange of medical knowledge.

She said that it is a constant fight in Congress to provide funds for medical research.

**Government Assistance**

Although Republicans claim that there has been a five fold increase in government

assistance during the last six years, she claimed the predominantly Democratic Congress was responsible for the increases over budgetary requests.
