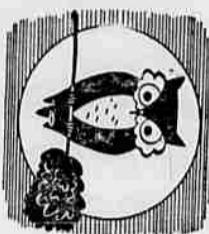

Commiss Said Tightening Hold on Army in Russia

Even Communists conceded he was present to demonstrate the importance of the Red army's role in Moscow's policy decisions.

Official Soviet publications have reported that there are enough party members in the armed forces to permit the creation of "self-contained party units," down to battalion level.

Party reports made clear that the party grip on the Red army has been steadily tightening. The new policy apparently was intended to insure that any major attempt to take the army into politics would be nipped in the bud.

What appears to have heightened this trend are the developments which spotlighted the role of the Red army since the U-2 incident and the abortive summit talks in Paris last spring.

There has been talk of discontent in the armed forces because of Khrushchev's demobilization plans, which are said to affect hundreds of thousands of officers and men.

Since the U-2 incident the army is said to have argued that Soviet defense need strengthening rather than reduction.

Ingrid Bergman Didn't Disapprove Hubby's Affair

New York—UPI—Actress Ingrid Bergman, 45, did not disapprove the love affair between her former husband, Roberto Rossellini, and Indian script writer Sonali Das Gupta in 1957.

In an article by Thomas B. Morgan in the September issue of Redbook Magazine, the oft-married screen star is quoted as saying the romance between Rossellini and Mrs. Das Gupta was "absolutely acceptable to me."

"When this other person came into the picture, I said 'fine,'" the magazine quoted Miss Bergman.

She noted that although her divorce from Rossellini came after the torrid love affair in India where Rossellini had gone to make a documentary film, their marriage was failing for some time prior to then.

Miss Gergman said, "Our marriage still might have continued, though. Children hold people together but Rossellini met someone else."

The actress, involved in a battle with Rossellini over custody of their three children, presently is married to Lars Schmidt, a Swedish theater impresario.

73 Cities in Oregon Lost Residents in Past Decade

Portland—UPI—Preliminary census figures showed Monday that 73 of 220 Oregon cities and towns lost population during the 10-year period from 1950 to 1960.

The figures, released by the Oregon State Census board, said 54.8 per cent, or 963,071, of the state's 1,756,366 persons live within boundaries of incorporated cities.

Oregon has added 10 new incorporated cities since 1960. They are Brookings, Cannon Beach, Detroit, Gates, Irrigon, Lowell, Lyons, Spray, Winston and Wood Village.

The figures listed Granite in Grant county as the smallest in population with just 3 persons. Other small incorporated communities include Lonerock in Gilliam county with 31, Ahaniko in Wasco county with 39 and Antelope in Wasco county with 45.

The majority of the state's cities increased in population. Some of the biggest increases include Beaverton, 165.5 per cent, with a 1960 population of 4,669; Oswego, 166.8 per cent, with a population of 8,846; Gold Beach, up 158.3 per cent with a population of 1,749, and Pilot Rock with a 99.9 per cent increase to 1,693.

The figures were not changed from earlier reports which listed Portland as the state's largest city at 371,032, a drop of 7 per cent. Some of the communities which had large population decreases included: Yamhill, 691, down 25.4 per cent; Vernonia, 1,095, down 28 per cent; Umatilla, 632, down 28.4 per cent; Sumpter, 96, down 34.2 per cent; Scotts Mills, 156, down 28.1 per cent; Rockaway, 789, down 25.1 per cent; Mitchell, 230, down 44.6 per cent; Lafayette, 553, down 18.5 per cent; Hammond, 426, down 18.4 per cent; Helix, 152, down 16.5 per cent; Elkton, 146, down 27.4 per cent, and Brownsville, 865, down 26.4 per cent.

Transit Strike Causes Boston's Worst Auto Tieup

Boston—UPI—A sudden transit strike made motorists of straphangers today and the old city experienced its worst traffic tie-up in memory. Gov. Foster Furcolo declared a state of emergency.

The strike began when a bus driver was suspended for refusing to leave on a run that would have brought him home two minutes late Monday. Word spread like wildfire through the system and one division after another closed down leaving commuters stranded.

New expressway approaches to the downtown area, suburban freeways and tunnel and bridge approaches were hopelessly clogged Monday night and again during today's rush hour. Overheated cars stalled and added to the chaos.

All on-street parking in Boston's central core was banned. The Metropolitan Transit authority sought a superior court injunction against the Carmen's Union.

Gov. Furcolo asked the Executive Council to authorize seizure of the system. The M.T.A. is a state-created private agency.

Court Fight Over Sunken Galleon Starts in Miami

Miami — (UPI) — Two treasure hunters cleared the decks today for a court fight over contents of a Spanish galleon sunk more than two centuries ago.

Relics were brought up from the galleon in 30 feet of water off the Florida Keys by Capt. Tim Watkins and his crew of the salvage ship "Buccaneer."

Watkins booty consists of coral-encrusted cannons, wine jugs, weapons, oxidized silver plate and an anchor from the vessel sunk about 227 years ago.

The galleon is thought to have been one of a fleet of 12 wrecked in a storm while carrying millions of dollars in South American silver.
