

Satellite Capsule Recovery Made Like Catch in Outfield

New York—(AP)—A 30-mile running catch at 126 miles an hour through the "outfield" of the ballpark in the central Pacific enabled an aircraft which had not been designated for the job to make history's first mid-air snare of a man-made "falling star."

But after it was caught, Air Force Capt. Harold E. Mitchell, pilot of the C119 Flying Boxcar plane that did it said today that the game changed from baseball into angling.

"We let our grappling hook line play out about 350 feet behind us before stopping the unreeeling," Mitchell said at a news conference.

"It's like getting a big bass on a fishing reel. You've got to let him play a little or you'll break the line."

The first was last Friday. On schedule, the Discoverer XIV capsule was re-entering earth's atmosphere from orbit and heading toward the "ballpark." After the capsule's parachute had opened, it dropped—a total estimated weight of 100 pounds—at about 1,400-1,600 feet a minute toward the surface.

Mitchell's plane got a bearing on the capsule and spotted it when it was at 16,000 feet. Mitchell made his first pass at it at 12,000 feet—and missed by six inches, too far to the left to hook the parachute with one of four four-pronged bronze grappling hooks trailing under and behind the plane on poles and on a trapeze-like arrangement of nylon lines.

He doesn't remember the altitude of the second pass—it was lower, of course. Missed again. Three feet high. The third pass was at 8,500 feet. "The last thing I remember as I lined up on it was Sgt. Bannick calling to me: 'Don't invert it!'"

T. Sgt. Louis Bannick, 39, wing operator who eventually veered in the "catch," explained that "inverting" was flying so close to the chute would come so close to the plane's belly that it would pass through the snare without being caught.

They Made History
"The first I knew that we had made history," Mitchell continued, "was when our safety officer called out—in a calm voice, I must say—'Good contact; got it in tow.'"

The safety officer was Sgt. Algaene Harmon, 28, Randolph County, Alabama.

"When we got back to base," Mitchell said, "my maintenance officer told me that he had become a devout Predestinationist Presbyterian. It must have been in the stars for us to pick it up. We were not the designated craft for the pickup."

Asked why he had missed on the first two passes, Mitchell shook his hands and said: "Nerves." He said he could "barely feel the jar" when the hook made contact with the parachute shrouds but that the plane had been slowed to reduce the shock.

Also at the news conference was 1st Lt. Robert Counts, 39, Hermiston, Ore., plane navigator who homed on the beacon signals emitted by the capsule. Mitchell said Counts asked for a 360-degree turn to get the bearing exactly, and then, "being a thorough young man," asked for another just to be sure. He said the catch was not a matter of luck.

Portland—Not since 1931 have forest fires in Oregon and Washington burned so much acreage in July, forest service records show.

Eight hundred seventy fires burned 66,557 acres of forest service protected land last month, according to J. Herbert Stone, regional forester, Portland. In that 31-day period 29 years ago, 355 fires burned 81,770 acres.

To Aug. 1, there had been 971 fires in 1960 which burned 68,872 acres in the Pacific Northwest region. This is five times the 1955-59 average for this time of year, Stone said.

In both 1931 and 1960, lightning caused the greatest number of fires. Of the 971 fires started by lightning, 704 were started by lightning. The total number of fires this year now exceeds 1,000, with lightning again causing trouble this month. Next to lightning, campers and smokers have caused the most fires.

Comparable to 1960
The year 1938 was comparable to 1960, with 2,261 fires burning 72,398 acres by Aug. 1. There were 825 fires in July that year, with total burn of 45,885 acres. July, 1941, had more fires (1,474) than July, 1960, but acreage burned was held to 19,895.

Of the 971 fires through July this year, only 23 were not controlled in initial stages and burned larger than 300 acres.

Hardest hit has been the Willow-Whitman National forests of eastern Oregon with 10 major fires, including the region's largest—the 20,000-acre Anthony Lake blaze near Baker. Next is the Umatilla National forest with six. The Willow-Whitman forest had 193 fires through July 31 and the Umatilla had 188.

Also high on the list are the Malheur, Fremont, Deschutes, Willamette, Rogue River, and Ochoco forests.

Eagle Point Man Is Arrested by Deputies
Jack Elbee Reed, 49, Eagle Point, was arrested early Monday by Jackson County Sheriff's deputies on charges of carrying a concealed weapon.

Deputies said they had received a report that Reed allegedly fired two shots outside a Shady Cove restaurant the day before. They traced him to Gold Hill where they found him with a pistol under his shirt. Deputies said the gun was loaded with six shells, and Reed had no permit to carry concealed weapons.

MOVES TO GUARD JEWELS
London—(UPI)—Elizabeth Taylor will give up life in a \$660 a week English mansion for the sake of her jewels. It was reported today.
