District 6C Schools Will Open Sept. 12

Central Point—Schools of District 6C, which include Sams Valley, Gold Hill, and Central Point, will open Monday, Sept. 12. Superintendent Charles A. Meyer announced today. School buses in all parts of the district will operate the first day on the same schedule as last year, he said. All cafeterias except the Central Point Junior High school cafeteria will operate the first day. The cafeteria in Central Point Junior High and Elementary school will operate if completed. Meyer said construction is not yet complete, but may be ready for school opening.

Navy Men Now Can Carry Liquor Aboard Ships

Washington—UPI—Navy men now can have a bottle in every port. But the high seas will remain the dry seas. A new regulation permits naval personnel to carry liquor aboard ships and planes. But it must be kept untouched under lock and key until the men reach shore. Naval officers said there always had been a lot of "petty cheating" on the old ban on carrying liquor. The change in regulations, announced Wednesday, puts the Navy in line with the Air Force and Army. The new regulation, however, does not put the Navy on the same footing as the British navy which, from time immemorial has allowed its seafaring men to have a no-gin of grog while aboard ship. Under the new U.S. rule naval personnel may carry a gallon of alcoholic beverages aboard ships and aircraft. They may not drink it until they go ashore. While in transit it must be registered with the commanding officer and "stored in securely locked compartments."

Fraternity Gives Chapters 'Way Out'

Portland—UPI—Delegates to the national convention of Sigma Nu fraternity Wednesday approved an amendment giving a "way out" for chapters facing a mandate to end racial discrimination or "get off the campus." The controversial amendment, which passed by a three-to-one vote, would allow chapters facing closure because of racial discrimination to appeal to the fraternity's high council for a waiver of racial qualifications for members.

Jury Ponders About Where Alcohol Was

Jackson, Miss.—Was the alcohol the policemen smelled on Wilbur Drury's head or on his breath? Drury, charged with drunk driving, said the odor of alcohol came from hair tonic. His barber testified that Drury received a haircut and tonic treatment at his shop on the day of the arrest. He said the hair tonic was 70 per cent alcohol. But policemen said in their opinion, Drury was staggering when they arrested him. The case ended in a mistrial when the jury gave up after three hours of debating the question.

Old Sailing Ship Now Tourist Draw

Beach Haven, N. J.—"Lucy Evelyn," say people around here, "is beached as high and dry as a marshmallow in a drained cocoa cup." She is a 140-foot packet and sailed the seas for many years. Now, the ship serves as a tourist attraction and houses a gift shop. Built in 1917 for \$64,000, authorities claim it would cost at least \$200,000 to duplicate her.

Committee Watches Fishing Operations

The committee was scheduled to go out again today for a first hand look at sports fishing in the area.
