Railroad Links Train Service

San Francisco — (UPI) — The Southern Pacific railroad Wednesday announced plans to combine its City of San Francisco and Overland trains between San Francisco and Ogden, Utah, Sept. 25.
 C. E. Peterson, an SP vice president, said the consolidation was necessary because of new schedules which would carry the two trains over the route at the same times.
 The new schedules, he said, were needed because other railroads had changed their time-tables.

Southern Pacific will file a notice of the change with the Interstate Commerce commission which could intervene.
 Peterson said all stops made by the two trains now will be made by the consolidated train, and that service east of Ogden will be unchanged. The City of San Francisco goes to Chicago and the Overland to St. Louis.

Hydrofoil Cruiser Leaves Tomorrow

Astoria — (UPI) — The 65-foot hydrofoil cruiser "Flying Fish" is scheduled to leave here for Bellingham, Wash., at 9 a.m. tomorrow—barring bad weather or another mechanical delay.

The craft, destined for speed passenger service across Puget Sound from Bellingham to Victoria, B.C., has been undergoing assembly and trial runs here.
 Several earlier departures were foiled, however, by eleven-foot swells at the mouth of the Columbia River and by minor mechanical difficulties.
 The \$200,000 craft, which skims the surface of the water on two pontoon-like foils, is only the second of its kind in North America. It will be taken up the Washington coast by Capt. Charles Cushing, engineer Ken Patton, and David Mason, a deck-hand.

Couple Divorced, And So Is Their Car

 Mrs. Henderson testified that her ex-husband had borrowed the wheels from her father and had never returned them.

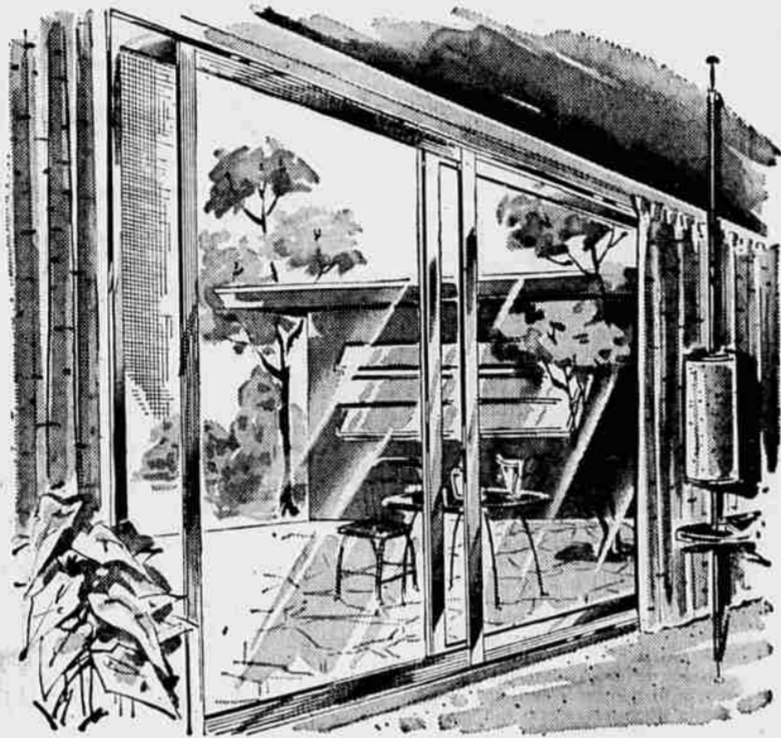
Ex-State Workers Get Jobless Benefits

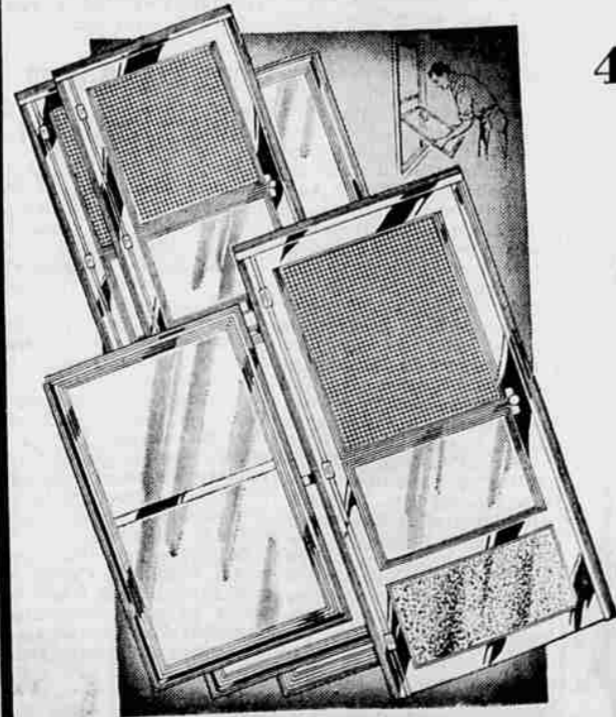

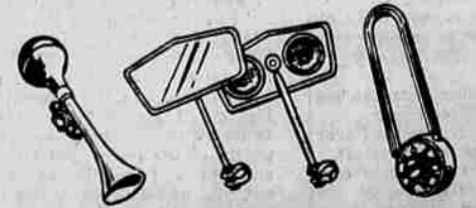
