

Homesteaders' Son Project Manager

Philadelphia—UPI—Ten years ago July 24 Cape Canaveral was launched into its pioneering mission in the Space Age. On hand in a key role was the son of pioneers of another age.

Robert H. Haviland, son of Kansas homesteaders, who lived in a sod house on this nation's frontier in the last century, was project manager on Bumper 8, which became the first missile fired from Cape Canaveral July 24, 1950.

Haviland currently is an advanced missile and space systems engineer with General Electric's Missile and Space Vehicle department here. For the past several years his job had been working on the development of satellites and space vehicles and their future applications.

He has just finished preparing a report on the use of satellites for weather forecasting. He was to deliver it before the 11th annual Congress of the International Astronautical federation in Stockholm during August.

Homes Resemble Echo Chambers

East Lansing, Mich. — (UPI) — Modern homes aren't echo chambers, but some of them are built like the next thing to it, says Robert Bullard, home building expert at Michigan State university.

A home ought to be sound conditioned like it is air conditioned or light conditioned, he said.

Today's homes have open floor plans, thin walls, more sound-bouncing glass and dry-wall, fewer and smaller rooms with fewer floor-to-ceiling partitions and modern furnishings that don't absorb as much sound as the old-style bulky kind.

Music is noise when you want to talk, and talk is noise when you want to listen to music, Bullard said.

Exports Higher Than Last Year

Cairo—UPI—Egypt's cotton exports are up from 4,437,449 kantars last season to 5,921,666 this year. A kantar is 99.05 pounds.

Russia remains the largest buyer and Czechoslovakia is second with purchases of 978,811 kantars and 720,455 kantars, respectively.

But only 49.1 per cent of cotton exports went to the Communist bloc this year in comparison with 61.7 per cent last year. Western countries took 28.5 per cent of the total exports this year in comparison with 24.6 per cent last year.

India is the third largest cotton buyer this year with purchases of 618,317 kantars.

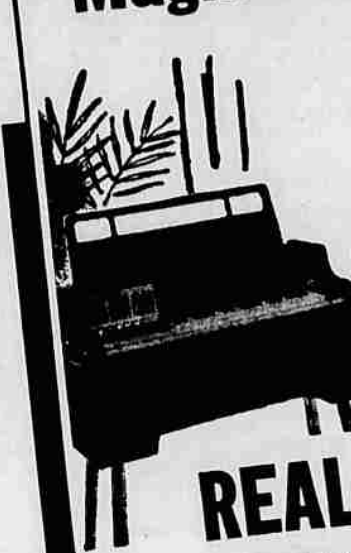
First man-made snowstorm in the U.S. was made by dropping dry ice on clouds over Mount Greylock, Massachusetts and the year was 1946.

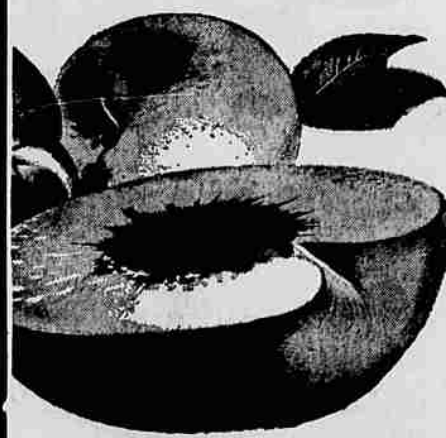
