U.S. Will Orbit Monkey in October

Washington — (AP) — Lt. Gen. Bernard A. Schriever, head of the Air Research and Development Command, said Friday the Air Force plans to launch a monkey into orbit in a Discoverer satellite in October.

He made official previous predictions that America's first effort to put a living being in orbit would be made with the Discoverer XVI.

Earlier plans to orbit life in the Discoverer XV in the next two or three weeks were changed because the spider monkey, weighing four or five pounds, and the capsule

which will carry it on a padded couch will not be ready in time.

Schriever also cast doubt on Russian claims that the space ship which returned a capsule full of animals to earth last Sunday was successfully recovered.

Potato Crop Hurt By Severe Frost

Yreka, Calif. — (AP) — A severe frost damaged 70 per cent of the 1960 potato crop in Tula Lake basin Tuesday night and caused more than \$1 million damage, according to a "conservative" estimate by Agricultural Commissioner Jess R. Grisham.

Grisham said Thursday the figure includes only the Siskiyou county area of the basin.

Only 30 per cent of the 4,500 acres in the county were free of damage as temperatures dropped in some pockets to as low as 21 degrees in the worst frost since 1945.

Grisham said his estimate, which he termed conservative, was based on last year's crop, valued at \$2,107,950 on 3,866 acres, plus a seed crop harvest of \$655,200 on 1,092 acres.
