Carole Says She and Finch Used Apartment To Talk, Have Lunch, Make Love

Los Angeles — (UPI) — Carole Tregoff, 23, today undergoes cross examination concerning her love affair with Dr. R. Bernard Finch and the death

of Barbara Jean Finch, the wealthy physician's socialite wife.

Miss Tregoff, sometimes composed, sometimes in tears, admitted Tuesday that she and Finch rented an apartment in nearby Monterey Park to have lunch, talk, listen to records and make love.

The former model sobbed as prosecutor Clifford Crail asked her time and time again what they did at the apartment.

Regains Composure
Carole, on the verge of tears during the preliminary questions, broke down completely and wept, holding her face in both hands. Crail suggested a recess when it appeared she could not stop.

Fifteen minutes later, her composure regained, Carole calmly replied that she and Finch were intimate in the apartment.

Over the repeated objections of defense attorneys, Crail questioned Carole about her knowledge of perjury because she had denied being intimate with Finch during questioning by police last year.

The disagreement led to shouting between Grant Cooper, Finch's attorney, and Crail. When Judge LeRoy Dawson interceded, Cooper said "I don't think your honor is being fair."

Dawson excused the jury and admonished Cooper when the panel had left the room.

"I'm not having any lawyer stand up and tell me what to do or how to run my court," Dawson said. "I am not being unfair and I'm not having you or any other lawyer tell me I am in front of a jury and a crowded courtroom."

Cooper apologized and an agreement was reached between the bench, prosecution and defense, that none of Miss Tregoff's testimony would have bearing on the case against Dr. Finch.

Committee Launches Investigation In Disappearance of Two NSA Men

Washington — (UPI) — The House committee on Un-American Activities has launched an investigation of the disappearance of two mathematicians employed by the ultra-secret National Security agency.

Committee Chairman Francis E. Walter (D-Pa.) ordered the inquiry Tuesday at the request of House Democratic Leader John W. McCormack (Mass.).

McCormack said he had information which "leaves no doubt" that the missing men fled to Russia with valuable information about secret U.S. codes.

The Defense department said Aug. 5 that the mathematicians, Beron F. Mitchell, Eureka, Calif., and William H. Martin, Ellensburg, Wash., probably had gone behind the Iron Curtain but had no information "prejudicial" to the

United States.

The Washington Daily News quoted Walter as saying one of the missing men had asked for and received information about the ill-fated U2 flight of Francis Gary Powers. The lawmaker was quoted as saying the information was requested before May 1, the date the plane was downed inside Russia.

The paper also quoted Walter as saying the two men had worked on the decoding of Russian communications concerning the U2 and other reconnaissance flights.

Loan For Seal Rock Project OK'd

Washington — (UPI) — The Community Facilities administration Tuesday announced a \$158,000 loan to the Seal Rock Water district, Oregon, to build a new water system in the Seal Rock area.

The new system will serve 425 persons in Seal Rock and the adjacent community.

U.S. College Student Said Spy Recruiter By Russians

Moscow — (UPI) — The Communist youth organ Komsomolskaya Pravda today named Richard Renaud Lane, a University of California student, as the alleged agent of American intelligence who recruited two Soviet youths for espionage.

The newspaper Tuesday reported the arrest of Vyacheslav Repnikov and Rostislav Rybkin as disgruntled, misguided juvenile delinquents, and charged that American tourists blackmailed them into espionage after plying them with vodka, jazz records, anti-Soviet literature and old clothes.

Today the paper traced the cloak and dagger story to the International Youth Festival of 1957, when it said thousands of foreign youths, including several score Americans, came to Moscow.

Komsomolskaya Pravda said Lane knew that Repnikov had smuggled out an anti-Soviet letter to Newsweek magazine. It said Repnikov was threatened with exposure unless the Russian agreed to cooperate more.

After clandestine meetings at Moscow cafes and exchanging a secret code, Repnikov undertook to communicate regularly with Lane through a succession of tourist couriers, the paper said.

Lane's address was given as Monterey.

The newspaper said Lane also visited Communist China with a student delegation and, after his return from China, told Repnikov he would send him books containing secret writing which would become legible after running a hot iron over the pages.

Lane acquainted Repnikov with the other agent, Rybkin, and both smuggled out their first report to Lane via an American actress then touring the Soviet Union, the paper said.
