

FAVORITES ADVANCE IN FIRST ROUND OF SOUTHERN OREGON

A cloudy, cool, drizzly, wet morning greeted the start of match play yesterday in the 32nd annual Southern Oregon Golf championships at Rogue Valley Country club here. But, this switch in the weather, from the sun and heat, which usually features the Labor day holidays classic, apparently bore no ill omen among competitors.

Defending champions, medalists, other past champions, and favorites in general, triumphed in the first round in the quest for laurels in the three divisions of the tournament.

The 1959 toga takers, Bob Prall, Salem, Miss Betty Martin, Longview, Wash., and Karl Bennett, Grants Pass, claimed opening victories in their respective men's, women's and senior men's divisions. Likewise, the 1960 low qualifiers, Ron Mitchell, Chico, Calif., Mrs. Helen Davies, Medford, and Marvin Clark, Grants Pass, moved into second round contention. Eddie Simmons, Medford, six times SO titlist, and Bob Atkinson, Portland Golf club, three times Southern Oregon and three times state amateur winner, also posted Thursday verdicts.

Men's Second Round
Thirty-two men's division victors engaged today in second round encounters and a few of the favorites were destined to fall by the wayside. Contenders in the women's and senior men's championship flights resume their rivalry in Saturday quarterfinals after a day of rest today.

There is no rest during the tournament for advanced in the men's championship and first flight. Today's 16 winners in each have their third matches of the tournament tomorrow. On Saturday men's championship and first flight have quarterfinals in the morning and semifinals in the afternoon. Semifinal action is slated in other tournament flights. Finals are on Monday, Sept. 5, Labor day, with 36 hole matches between the finalists in the regular men's and women's championship flights. Other finalists go 18 holes.

Rogue Valley Country club and tournament invite residents of the valley to join the galleries and watch the matches. There is no charge to spectators for admission.

Prall Beats Flink
Prall, even par at the finish yesterday, defeated Lee Flink, of RVCC and Pocastello, Idaho. Today the defending champion faced Jack Mattison, scratch player from Eugene. Mattison, 4 down after nine holes, rallied to beat Ed Davis, also Eugene, on the extra 10th hole.

Mitchell played one over par in beating Bob McDevitt, Devils Lake, 4 and 2. He was 1 up at the turn and won Nos. 12, 15 and 16 with his steady game. The medalist today went out against Dr. N. J. Wilson, Medford, who trimmed clubmate Dick House 6 and 5.

Miss Martin turned back Mrs. C. E. Wheelock, Columbia-Edgewater, Portland, 3 and 2, and Mrs. Davies, picking up strength on the back nine, beat Mrs. Raymond Scott, Eastmoreland, 4 and 3. Bennett downed Norm Bruck, Oswego Lake, and Clark, twice senior champion, turned back Starr Hanks, San Francisco, 2 up.

Sensational Win
Simmons recorded the most sensational win of the day in beating Dr. Robert Buck, another home clubber, 1 up in the men's championship chase. Four up on Buck and one under par after 13 holes, Simmons bogied on the next four greens and Buck caught up on No. 17.

The former champ, went into the trap on his second shot on 18. After Buck parked his third shot near the cup, Simmons fired out of the trap spectacularly and was set up for a putt slightly longer than his foe. He sank the putt for a bird. Buck missed and that decided the issue. The outcome sent Simmons against Sam Cavalli, C-E, who won from Vern Perry, Portland, 4 and 3.

Atkinson was even par at the turn in topping DeRoss Kinkade, Hidden Valley. His rival today was Lou Stafford, Columbia-Edgewater, former National Public Links finalist. Stafford was three under par for nine holes in tripping Jim Bucello, Sonoma, Calif., 5 and 4.

Men's victor by the widest gap yesterday was Dick Yost, C-E, whose 8 and 7 spread sent the Walker Cupper and ex-state and northwest champion today against Bob Hamilton, Eugene. Hamilton won over Bud Hackett, Medford, 6 and 5.

A pair of Rogue Valley adversaries today were Dr. Ralph Odell and Harry Millette who were once above par yesterday in winning matches by 2 and 1 counts. Odell took Wally Ball, Broadmoor, Port-

land, and Millette beat E. C. Hall, RVCC.

Longest championship flight match yesterday saw Larry Holland, Broadmoor, four 22 holes to edge A. J. Tozly, Royal Oaks, Vancouver, Wash. Stew Schroeder, of the home course, second low qualifier, bopped Bruce McDonald, Broadmoor, 3 and 2.

Dr. William Miller, Medford, utilized a spectacular shot from out of the rough on No. 18 to prevent an extra hole match and preserve a 2 up win over Jon Sivertsen, Tacoma, Wash. Jack Kerr, Harold Finney, Redwood Empire with one under par.

Longest match of Thursday was in the men's seventh flight. Bob Hamilton, Seattle, Wash., went 27 holes to beat Gene Teel Hoyt Park, Portland.

Senior title eliminations put Clark against an old rival, M. L. Hallmark, Roseburg; Ralph Swan, Royal Oaks, against Ray Beebe, Reames club, Klamath Falls; defending champ Karl Bennett against Rogue Valley club champion Larry Butler and Bob Wondery, Royal Oaks, against Cy Harbeck, San Francisco. Clark and Bennett, Grants Pass residents who have monopolized the senior crown, are playing under the banner of the host club. The first two senior togas, in 1957 and 1958, were taken by Clark.
