New York—(UPI)—L. O. Hooper of W. E. Hutton and Co., notes that thus far in 1960, the stock market has failed consistently to do what it has threatened.  
Threatening to break out on the downside, it has met support at around 596-600, while the upside spearhead has encountered an overhanging supply of shares to dent the thrust.  
Walter K. Gutman of Stearns and Co. feels that the odd figures show a relatively high proportion of sales to purchases in recent days, a condition which frequently indicates that market strength will develop. It believes that patient holders will be rewarded by purchases around the current level.  
Reynolds and Co. recommends purchase of Emerson Electric Manufacturing Co. It says earnings this year may well approach \$3.00 a share against \$2.26 for fiscal 1959. Prospects for 1961 seem favorable, too, Reynolds says.  
Gerson of Wall Street feels that although Decca Records has been one of the strongest gainers in the market this year, the issue should be held for further price appreciation. The company is making a good showing in its entertainment operations, the report says, and the company has attracted a strong following in Wall Street.

**New Central Office  
For Telephone Firm  
Said on Schedule**

Pacific Telephone North-west's new \$82,000 central office building for Ashland is progressing on schedule.  
The contracting firm, Ausland Construction company, has completed the foundations, floors and walls of the one-story structure, according to Telephone Manager Jack C. Greager. The construction schedule calls for the building to be finished Oct. 31.

Greager said new dial equipment to be installed in the building and placed in operation next April, will require that all Ashland telephone numbers be completely changed.  
The prefix for the new numbers will be "HU 2" instead of the prefixes Murdock 2, 5 and 9 now in use. The last four digits of all numbers will also change.  
Explains Prefix  
In early planning for the number change, Greager said, the HU was meant to indicate the prefix name, Hunter. But telephone companies throughout the country are now abandoning prefix names on telephone numbers in favor of letter-and-number combinations like "HU 2". Or in some cases all numeral prefix codes like "482" are being assigned.

"You will notice that even now our information operators do not give the prefix name of Ashland numbers, but just say 'the number is MU 2-1234', or whatever it might be," Greager added.  
So when the new Ashland telephone numbers go into use next April, the HU portion of the number will not have any name significance. Greager said the change to this new type of telephone number prefixes is being done to increase the possible number of control office prefix codes from 600 under the old method to about 800 under the new system.  
Main reasons behind the

need for more prefix codes is the tremendous growth in the number of telephones in the country, and the constant expansion of direct distance dialing of long distance calls. Direct distance dialing of calls from Ashland is still some time in the future, Greager indicated. But the new equipment to be installed has been engineered for that purpose.

**Applications May  
Be Filed By Vets**  
Veterans of World War II and Korean service who become totally disabled between the date of their application for National Service Life Insurance and the subsequent effective date may now file application for premium waiver. S. T. Brannock, contact representative, VA District Office, White City, said today.  
In calling attention of veterans and their kin to this new law, Brannock explained that the total disability must have been incurred in line of duty between Oct. 8, 1949, and July 31, 1946, or between June 27, 1950, and April 30, 1951.  
The insured must have remained continuously so disabled until his death or until June 8, 1960, whichever was earlier, Brannock said.  
Application for waiver of premiums must be filed by the insured, or if dead, by the beneficiary within two years after June 8, 1960. Applications will also be accepted from persons representing mentally incompetent veterans, Brannock stated.  
Because of the time limit placed upon applications, the VA urges eligible veterans or their beneficiaries to apply promptly for the waiver of premiums.
