Sickle Cell Anemia

Occasionally, someone asks me if there is any real cure for his sickle cell anemia. Also, he wants to know what it is. It is an anemia in which some of the red blood cells, instead of looking like an after-dinner mint, look a bit like a tiny sausage bent over like an old-fashioned sickle or grass cutter. Associated with this deformity of the cells is a peculiarity in the chemistry of the hemoglobin (red coloring matter in the blood). Because the disease runs in families, it is not likely ever to be "cured." Fortunately, in many cases, there is "sickling" without much anemia. I get letters from people who want to know if I think an herb tea will keep their diabetes under control. No, I am sure it won't. The only thing I would expect it to do would be to throw some business in the way of their mortician. So many people are so averse to going to the trouble of taking care of their diabetes with diet or insulin or now, medicine taken by mouth, that they will gladly fall for the scheme of an ignoramus or crook who comes along with an attractive promise. I remember two brothers who became millionaires—selling colored water to suckers—calling it a handy substitute for insulin. At last, the law caught up with them and the judge who sentenced them gave them a tongue-lashing. As he said, they were not only crooks but murderers: in thousands of cases their "medicine" must have been responsible for the death of the person who took it—when he should have been taking insulin. Blood Sugar Tests People want to know if they should have a blood-sugar test. They certainly should, perhaps once a year, if they have diabetes in the family, and especially if they are getting fat, or if their skin is itchy, or they are having trouble with boils. A Metallic Taste in the Mouth Many persons, almost all of them past middle-age, ask me why they have a metallic or nasty taste in their mouth. Some say it came suddenly one day. No doctor can see anything wrong in the mouth. Often the tongue or the lining of some part of the mouth or tongue burns. Obviously, something is wrong in one of the nerves that supply the mouth, or perhaps more likely, in the "center" in the brain to which the nerve runs. In hundreds of these cases it seems to me that the most probable cause is a "little stroke." I know of no medicine that ever helps. Morse Says Washington Is Becoming 'Notorious For an Alcoholic Breath'

Washington—(AP)—A senator complained Wednesday that the nation's capital is becoming "notorious for an alcoholic breath." Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., also declared: "Why, you can even get a cocktail served in the chancery of some of the churches." He made the comments in opposing any possible attempt to speed Senate passage of a House-approved bill to permit the sale of liquor in the District of Columbia next New Year's day. Under district law, Washington bars will have to stop serving alcoholic drinks at midnight on New Year's Eve because Jan. 1 falls on a Sunday. The House has okayed a measure to permit celebrants to have a drink after the clock strikes midnight next Dec. 31. Morse asserted that he would not back legislation that would permit a "big drunken rendezvous" or violate the Sabbath. "I don't want to put a dollar sign on the Sabbath," he said. He objected to Senate consideration of the House bill.

Reserve Unit Is Third In Nation

Omaha, Neb.—Rear Admiral Donald T. Eller, commander of the Naval Reserve Training Command headquarters here, recently announced the Medford, Ore., Reserve electronics division placed third in national competition for the year ending June 30. The nation-wide reserve units competed on the basis of attendance, active duties, correspondence courses, and inspection trips. Both personnel and administration are key factors considered. Eller said that competition for the annual awards was keener this year than at any time in the past. The Medford unit did "fairly well" last year, and earlier this summer placed first in district competition. Reserve spokesmen say Medford was notified of the placing in mid-August, and was required to send verification of their activities. First in the national competition was Ashland, Ky., and Chillicothe, Ohio, was second. Awards were also presented to reserve units in surface, submarine, and "CB" divisions.
