Engelmann Spruce
Picea engelmannii
Diameter—1 1/2 to 3 1/2 feet.
Height—80 to 150 feet.
Bark—Reddish Brown, thin, scaly.
Needles—1 inch long, stiff, disagreeable odor when crushed.
Cones—2 inches long with thin scales, light brown.
Seed—1/4 inch long. Large crops every 3 to 6 years.
Range—Entire Western Pine Region except South Dakota and California.

MOUNTAIN TREE—Mountain country is Engelmann spruce's favorite habitat. Increasing volumes of this quality wood have become available in recent years as access roads were pushed farther into the hinterlands. Politicians Take Advantage of Fair For Hand Shaking

Salem — If you want a sure bet, try the flow of politicians at a State Fair. And put your money on a heavy one.
Oregon's 1960 state fair is no exception. In fact, it is practically the rule.
There was a bumper crop on Labor Day.

Hand-shakers included U.S. Senate candidates Maurice Neuberger, Democrat, and Elmo Smith, Republican; Mary Owens, Democratic 1st district congressional candidate; GOP candidates Howell Appling Jr., for secretary of state; Howard Belton, for state treasurer, and Walter Norblad, incumbent 1st district congressman.
Hatfield There, Too
Although a non-candidate this year, Gov. Mark Hatfield was there, too, stumping for other Republicans.
Tuesday Monroe Sweetland, Democratic candidate for secretary of state, held down the fort.

On Wednesday, of course, there was Democratic presidential nominee John F. Kennedy, along with a host of other top Democrats, the familiar faces.
Most of the state candidates plan periodic visits the rest of the week to shake all available hands.
Political Booths
There are three political booths at the fair—Democratic and GOP headquarters, and a special Nixon booth dispensing campaign buttons, car bumper stickers, cards and pamphlets.

There is even a sheet giving "four favorite recipes of Pat Nixon—Sunday waffles, broiled grapefruit, chocolate butter cookies and angel pie.

The Republicans also had a mechanical elephant for the kiddies to ride and the Democrats mustered a donkey or two.
Kennedy and Nixon hats were selling for a dollar each and buttons of all types were being passed out by the thousands.

Vets Assured of Kennedy Support

Portland — (UPI) — A spokesman for a veterans group said Wednesday Sen. John F. Kennedy has assured World War I veterans in Oregon he supports their views on improved benefits for veterans of the first world war.

Jack Mebus, legislative committee chairman for Oregon of the Veterans of World War I, said the Democratic presidential candidate set forth his position in a telegram Tuesday.
Mebus said he asked Kennedy for his opinion after some members of the organization expressed skepticism that Kennedy really supported the Democratic platform plank pertaining to improved benefits for World War I veterans. Kennedy wired Mebus: "Please be assured I stand 100 per cent behind 1960 Democratic national platform plank on World War I veterans."

Coos Bay Man Gets Prison Term

Coquille — (UPI) — Paul Courter Holland, 33, of Coos Bay, Wednesday was sentenced to a total of 25 years in the state penitentiary on rape and burglary charges following his arrest Tuesday night.

Police said Holland was arrested in the clothes closet of a North Bend apartment.

He waived preliminary court actions and pleaded guilty in Circuit Court here Wednesday. He received a 20-year sentence for rape in connection with an Aug. 8 attack on a North Bend woman and a 5-year sentence for burglary.

Police said loot from several burglaries was found in a garage. They also said he had admitted other attacks on women in the Coos Bay-North Bend-Empire area dating back to May of 1958. Officers said they had been watching him since Aug. 17.

Kennedy Gets Lift In Hatfield's Car

Salem — (UPI) — Democratic presidential nominee John F. Kennedy got a campaign lift Wednesday in a Republican governor's car.

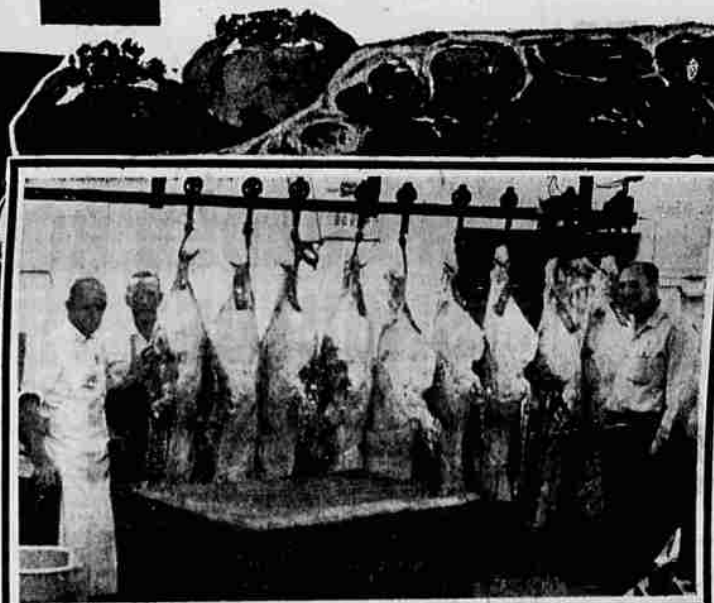
