Movie Break Comes Fast for Student After School Play

Hollywood — (UPI) — Paula Prentiss is a new Hollywood actress whose movie break came so fast that her luggage went east and she traveled west.

Pretty Miss Prentiss never expected to be heading for California when the school term ended at Northwestern University last June so she shipped her luggage to Pennsylvania, where she'd planned on doing summer stock, and New York, for fall job hunting.

But, luck was on Paula's side and she got a call to come to Hollywood for a screen test.

Didn't Expect Contract

"Oh, I'd been talking to Hollywood people before the term ended but I never expected to get a contract," she said. "A man from the Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer eastern talent division came to Northwestern and saw me in a play.

"He liked it and asked me to visit New York and do a scene for him. I returned to school after the New York trip and was surprised to get a message telling me to go to Hollywood for a screen test."

Paula's screen test impressed producers of "Where the Boys Are" and they gave her a top role in the film. It's a comedy part and Miss Prentiss is being given the once over as a possible successor to some of filmland's lady laugh-getters who've been inactive of late.

"Oh, I don't know just how well I'll do in comedy," she said. "I like it very much and want to be a character actress which would include comedy."

"However, I'm in no position to say what I'll be received as. To pick parts takes time and experience in this business."

Paula never did any professional acting before coming to Hollywood, full of fright over her movie prospects.

"I was scared out of my wits," she said. "I was worried to death about my screen test. But, when I went in front of the cameras it seemed that everybody had something else to do and didn't care about me."

"You know, it helps your own concentration to know that other people are concentrating on their work."

Pilgrimage of Mourners Pass Earl Long's Bier

Baton Rouge, La. — (UPI) — Louisiana's greatest pilgrimage of mourners since the death of Huey Long Wednesday filed past the ashen remains of Huey's little brother Earl, gaudiest of an untamed breed of politicians.

The wasted body in the bronze casket was that of the late congressman-nominee, but to the thousands expected to view it here he will always be the governor or "Uncle Earl."

The three-time governor died Monday under an oxygen tent at an Alexandria hospital, nine days after his nomination to Congress at a time when it was believed his political career had ended.

Monument Illuminated

Among the hushed file of mourners in the flower-scented statehouse lobby, a fat woman streaming with sweat was heard to mumble to a friend, "D'ya think they'll bury him out there with his brother?"

Huey's body lies under a tall white monument illuminated at night by a spotlight atop the Capital skyscraper he built.

"They ought to," was the whispered reply. "I was never for him, but he's served so long, so long."

Hilltop Graves Site

In fact, Earl Kemp Long was to be buried today on a hilltop at Winnfield, on the 25th anniversary of the assassination of Huey, "The Kingfish."

State police Tuesday counted more than 7,200 visitors to the flower-filled rotunda of the Capitol. A double bank of wreaths pressed in from the marble walls of the vast lobby.

Behind the casket was the red, white and blue bunting Earl used in his campaigns. On one side was the flag of the United States, on the other, that of Louisiana.

Britain To Banish Farthing From Coin System This Year

London — (UPI) — Britain announced recently it will banish the lowly farthing (about 1/4 of a cent) from its coinage at the end of the year, but it's already apparent the four-penny midgit won't die without a fight.

Its senior relation, the guinea (\$2.93), was dropped as a coin of the realm some 140 years ago but despite disrepute survives today in commerce and trade.

The guinea remains the standard quote for the fees of practically all professional men. When it comes to bids at the plush auctions of jewels and objects d'art, or even the sale of cattle, the standard rates still are guineas. Most of the better shops price their wares in guineas. The long-gone guinea thrives on the awkward arithmetic it involves — it being the term for 21 shillings, one more shilling than in the pound.

Already Scorned

The one-thousand times less valuable farthing has been handed around as legal tender since about the year 1280, working its way downwards through the ranks from silver to tin, to copper to bronze.

Shopkeepers will refuse them as 1960 closes; bus conductors already scorn them.

Schoolteachers are waiting the signal to drop them from the money tables. While the public probably keeps some sentimental affection for a coin that has lingered so long, few trouble to pocket them.

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Atom Smashers With Super High Energies Urged

Rochester, N. Y. — (Science Service) — Atom smashers having super high energies can and should be built to probe more deeply into the atomic nucleus, an international group of 30 physicists meeting informally here have agreed.

The five Russian scientists attending the informal meeting reported for the first time that construction has started on a 70 billion electron volt accelerator near Moscow. When completed in a few years, this machine will be the world's most powerful, more than twice as powerful as any now operating.

In Higher Energy Class

The atom smashers agreed upon as "feasible and desirable" by the international group are, however, in a much higher energy class, some 300 billion electron volts. This is 100 times more powerful than either the Brookhaven National Laboratory or CERN accelerators.

Estimated cost for the 300

Bev machine and its required equipment is \$300 million. The question of how such a machine should be financed was not considered by the group. Informally some scientists have suggested that it be built and operated under an international cooperative program. Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer, director of the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, N.J., backs such a plan.

Used as Microscope

Besides the five Russian scientists and one Polish physicist attending the informal meeting, representatives of the U.S., Germany, and United Kingdom, Italy and CERN (an international unit of 13 European nations) attended.

Kentucky Vets Asked To Apply for Bonus

Veterans who entered the service from Kentucky have been urged to apply for the Kentucky veterans bonus, according to County Service Officer Jerry V. Bianco.

He noted that Kentucky officials cannot reach a decision on whether to pay a bonus to out-of-state veterans until they determine how many Kentucky veterans are residing in other states.

Applications may be made at the veterans service office, court house, Medford.

Anti-Flea Dog Food Found Accidentally In OSC Experiment

Washington — (UPI) — "Every dog has his day" is about to become true for millions of flea-bitten dogs.

Little did author Miguel de Cervantes know when he penned his famous line about dogs in "Don Quixote" sometime between 1547 and 1616 A.D. that some day dogs would get relief from fleas.

That day apparently is in the offing. An Agricultural Research Service entomologist has stumbled on an anti-flea dog food which eventually may make a dog's life worth living.

The anti-flea element when mixed in dog food permeates the dog's body. When the flea bites the dog, the flea gives up the ghost.

Makes Discovery

The Agriculture Department said the discovery was made by Dr. R. J. Goulding at the Oregon Experiment Station at Oregon State College, Corvallis.

Goulding was testing chemicals for control of cattle parasites when he conceived the

idea that certain chemicals mixed in dog food might protect dogs from fleas.

Working with a veterinarian and a parasitologist, he added to dog food two chemicals that had been thoroughly tested and used as a food supplement in beef rations.

Two dogs ate the dog food and then were exposed to a carefully counted number of fleas for four days. At the end of the trial period, 89 to 95 per cent of the fleas were dead.

Reduces Stomach Worms

The dogs received another boon from the chemicals. Veterinarians checking them discovered that the chemicals also markedly reduced stomach worms.

Goulding said development of a chemical-food combination which kills fleas also may have important results in prevention of certain diseases. Most rodents carry fleas, and these fleas frequently are infected with disease.

Before a flea-proof food can be perfected and marketed,

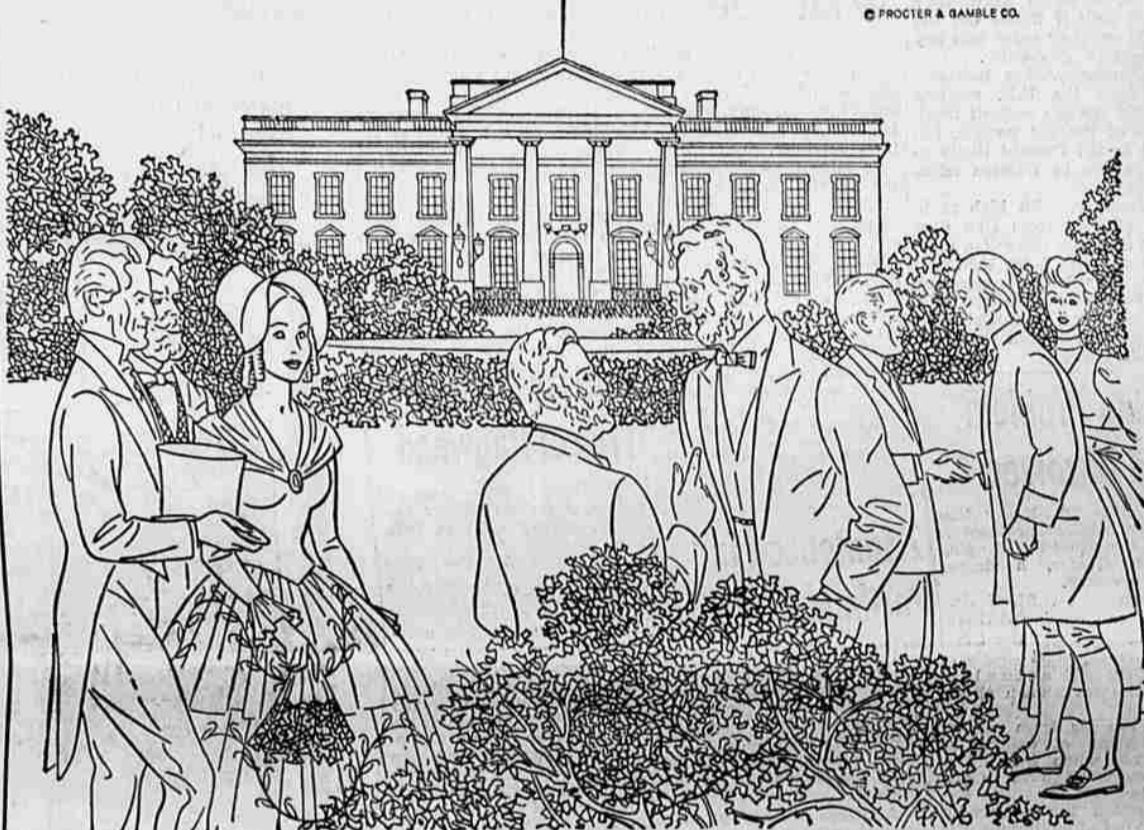
