Doctors Urged To Suspect Hematoma In Behavior Cases

New York—UPI—A medical scientist has alerted practicing doctors to their "opportunity of appearing simultaneously brilliant and useful." All they have to do is to keep in mind that the human brain often is used for a purpose which does it no good.

"With the aid of such propellants as alcohol and gasoline, it commonly functions as a projectile," said Dr. Leonard W. Jarcho of the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, in lamenting the frequency with which the consequence is first discovered on the autopsy table.

The consequence is a clot of mass of escaped blood—a "hematoma"—just below the brain's enveloping membrane sac, the dura. Such a body both interferes with brain work and increases pressure inside the skull and later death results, sooner or later death results. Must Be Suspected

To appear "simultaneously brilliant and useful" a doctor must suspect such a hematoma exists when bizarre behavior or nervous afflictions appear suddenly in people never before given to such, and proceed at once to life-saving brain surgery, Jarcho said.

These hematomas can result from blows to the head of much lesser force than those which break the scalp and produce bleeding, thus causing an obvious "head injury" that will be investigated thoroughly and watched carefully.

The unsuspected ones occur most often in persons who are least likely to remember a shock to the head when questioned by a doctor, namely alcoholics and aged persons, Jarcho continued in the technical journal, "Medical Science."

A degree of interference with intellectual function occurs in virtually all patients. A patient who answers questions sensibly at one moment gradually slips into stupor the next.

Memory Suffers

"Dullness, inattentiveness, and lack of initiative are likely to be present even at times of greatest lucidity. Orientation may be defective and memory usually suffers badly. The simplest mathematical calculation cannot be performed."

The only remedy is to get

rid of the clot of blood. This usually is done by cutting two buttons out of the skull and using the holes for "through and through irrigation."

This is "simple" to do, Jarcho said, and "ordinarily is carried out under local anesthetics. Often the stuporous patient begins to recover consciousness in the operating room."
