Klamath National Wildlife Refuge Becomes Reality

Washington — The Interior department announced Thursday that the Klamath Forest National Wildlife Refuge is now a fact of life in southern Oregon.

If the migratory birds which feed in its marshes can't tell the difference, the Klamath Indians soon will. For the Interior department will turn over \$476,401 to the Portland office of the bureau of Indian affairs for distribution to Klamath tribal members.

The move is part of the plan for salvaging for conservation purposes portion of the Klamath Indian reservation which the tribe is disposing of under the act which terminates federal trusteeship over this group of Indians. Much of the timberland is expected to become a national forest.

Stamps Finance Plan
The marshes, located in upper Klamath Basin, on which birds of the Pacific flyway feed will hereafter be administered and protected by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife service. The new wildlife refuge comprises 14,841 acres, bought from the tribe, plus 585 acres acquired privately earlier.

Interior explained that it had left untouched about 1,000 acres in Wocus bay, which has been of importance for traditional Klamath ceremonial functions.

Funds for the purchase came from receipts obtained from sale of duck hunting stamps. The bureau of sport fisheries and wildlife said it planned to maintain the refuge as a primary nesting ground for several species of diving ducks which are in short supply, as well as other migratory waterfowl.
